

# February 4/5, 2017: 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Isaiah 58:6-10: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5: Matthew 5:13-16

The sun rises on a new day. The light that reaches out from the horizon unfolds with lengthy promise. Each day is a blank canvas to create and play, to live in God's freedom, to grow in wisdom, and sing to the glory of God. At least, that's what the hymns we hear in church tell us. "Come, dance in the forest, come, play in the field," says the Canticle of the Sun. Glory and praise to our God! Sing a new song unto the Lord! These songs burst at the seams with new opportunity for growth and adventure. We like to envision our spiritual lives standing at the brink of a peak experience—a life-changing moment awaits just around the corner.

However, life often reveals itself in tones far more monotonous than our hymns portray. The daily grind, the rat race, the humdrum of routine—existence can drearily unfurl before us as a seemingly endless trudge. The open-ended promise of each day fades with each opportunity not taken, each measure of the song melting into the next. It is here, in the actual nitty-gritty minutiae of our lives that God has come to shine a light. Christ's light shines through the mundane, so we will grow into God's freedom.

Share your bread, cover the naked, silence all hateful speech, remove the burden from your neighbour—do these things for each other, because God has done them for you already. God's light breaks forth like the dawn, lighting up the noonday gloom, so we have the freedom to do the same. Our inner cynic longs to be dazzled with sweeping acts of power, yet God sends us the humble light of Christ. God revealed Christ to us, not in impressive works, but in weakness; not in lofty words of wisdom, but in the folly of the crucifixion. The crucifixion is neither fitting, nor impressive—just another victim crushed in the apathetic wheels of oppression, same as it ever was. By all standards of reason, the world would be justified in hiding the crucifixion away. It's too ugly, too boring, and too stupid a thing to be worth any time and attention, "as one from whom others hide their faces." Yet by God's good pleasure, Christ hung on the cross as the light of the world, the crown of all creation, a beacon of hope for all those forgotten, lost, or trampled underfoot.

The powers that be continue to work in the world. Negligent of those who suffer, their great wheels restlessly thrash about with an energy that contradicts the listlessness in their hearts. Closing borders, disrupting lives, sowing chaos, and feeding hatred, the powers of the world know the opposite of freedom. It can happen anywhere in the world. When it does, we lock again to Christ crucified, who himself was tom to shreds by the same powers, and we see in his face the dawning of a new day. The day of the Lord is today, because God has set the light of Christ before us once more, so we will shine that light for all to see. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate
