

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Job 7:1-4, 6-7; 1 Cor 9:16-19, 22-23; Mark 1:29-39

The ambo is no mere reading stand; it is the edge we climb up to God in prayer and it is the precipice from which God stretches down to us. It is reserved for the Word of the Lord. From Sacred Scripture we hear all manner of messages: accounts of God's actions in the past, songs of praise and thanksgiving, letters written from apostles to their church communities, and stories of Jesus' life. From the same ambo, we also hear eulogies for our loved ones, we offer our petitionary prayers on behalf of the world, and we listen to our pastor break open the readings to show us some good news.

We respond to what we hear, often out of reflex, but sometimes because what we are moved to cry out in agreement. We might nod our heads enthusiastically with the prophet Micah, "what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" In the same way, we might shake our heads in frustration or sadness at some of the things we hear. In those times we might withhold our voice, even as the people around us give a resounding, "Thanks be to God." It can be very lonely to stand in silence amid a congregation that is oblivious to how the words from the ambo have wrenched at one's heart.

Today's first reading shows us that there is a lot of room in how we respond to God. Our responses do not have to always be pious thanksgiving. Job, the poster boy of meaningless suffering, does not shy away from giving voice to his misery. He fought against the facile explanations of his friends and carved out space for his lamentation. One line today stands out in light of the Gospel, "But the night is long, and I am full of tossing until dawn." Jesus encountered endless crowds looking for healing, "The whole city was gathered around the door." The text tells us that he healed "many"-that could be a lot of people, but it may not have been all of them. I wonder if Jesus just couldn't physically get to all of the people. Maybe they were a bottomless pit of suffering that could never be filled. Did encountering the black hole of others' neediness and his own limitations to satisfy them cause him to toss and turn in bed; did it make him run off to a deserted place to pray? Driven to the edge, he turned to God in meditation and received the peace he needed to go on. Jesus prays for us, so we never stand alone when we're at the edge of our limits. It is from those outskirts that we run to when there is nowhere else to turn that we find God, standing there to wait with us until dawn.


