February 8/9, 2014: 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Isaiah 58:6-10; Ps. 112; 1 Corinthians 2:1-5; Matthew 5:13-16

Have you ever dug into the back of your pantry, past the bags of chip-crumbs and flour, only to discover an unopened box of something—now well past its prime—that you forgot you had? Maybe you were going through a phase: you thought you would do more home baking or you would start eating more legumes and pulses. So you came home from the store that day with a bag of almond slivers, shredded coconut, or red lentils, with every good intention of using the new ingredient. Now, years later, what was once a symbol of hope and new beginnings has become a stale reminder that change is an arduous, if not impossible task. "Of all the words of mice and men, the saddest are, 'It might have been." Kurt Vonnegut's paraphrase applies all too well to that moment when the now-unviable fare is pitched in the trash bin and that feeling of lost opportunity sinks in. Now stop and think: have you ever had to do that with salt?

Salt never goes bad and it is always useful. Finding forgotten salt on the back of the shelf is as good as finding a crisp ten-dollar bill in your spring coat pocket. The always-empty shaker will now be flush for months. It's a gift from your past self to the person you are today—a reminder of where you have been and how far you have come. Salt testifies to the enduring and the persistent; it never loses its saltiness.

For those of us whose faith has wound up on our back shelves, tucked away behind the other ingredients of our lives, God is already finding a way in. This is especially true for those of us who come to church regularly. Familiarity and comfort can dull the wonder of the mysteries that we celebrate. "You are the salt of the earth," Jesus proclaims. You are always useful and never spoil. God will never throw you away. God rejoices again and again at discovering us anew, like a child coming across an old photo of their parent when they were young and adventurous. God catches glimpses of us that we forgot were there, and delights in us. Since God cherishes us, we too can relish the hidden parts of ourselves and bring them into the light. With God, there is no shame over what might have been, only rejoicing at what has been preserved, even after all these years.



The Empty Bowls Project:

This year, St. John Brebeuf Parish and School hopes to really make an impact in our community as we help our youth understand the effects of hunger and poverty in our neighborhoods and in our world.



During the months of February and March St. John Brebeuf School students, along with students of the Catechism classes of St. John Brebeuf Parish will be creating their own unique bowls to symbolize those who go hungry each day. These bowls will be designed, painted, glazed and then fired in a kiln.

On April 27, 2014, the entire parish community will come together to share a simple meal of soup and bread. The limited menu is to signify to everyone involved that many homes do not experience an abundance of food at meal times and that often children go away from the table hungry.

At the dinner, all of the art the students have created and the bowls they have made will be displayed and shared with the community, with each family having the chance to take home their child's bowl.


