January 9/10, 2016: Baptism of the Lord

Baptism of the Lord: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Acts 10:34-38; Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

Is there a verb for "doing justice"? "Justice" brings to mind all kinds of principles—fairness, righteousness, decency, moral uprightness, truthfulness—yet there doesn't seem to be an action that strictly describes bringing justice about. So when the prophet Isaiah talks about God's chosen servant who will "bring forth justice," what exactly is he doing to make justice happen? "A bruised reed he will not break and a dimly burning wick he will not quench." Whatever actions this servant would take, they would be peaceful enough to not disturb a smoldering candle. Yet this servant's strength and will are such that, "He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice in the earth." Looking at Jesus' life, we see what Isaiah meant; God's servant, a teacher and a healer, both gentle and strong.

Yet our image of Christ as this perfect servant of God can feel unrealistic to the extent that it puts him out of touch with our daily lives. To us, Christ can feel like a monk-like superhero, wandering around in a robe and sandals, dispensing wisdom, curing the sick, righting wrongs, teaching people the ways of the Force... I mean, the Holy Spirit. It's a neat story, but when the curtain falls and it's time to clear out the theater, what do we take with us? Do we look around and see this justice established in our world? Usually, the dim candles of our world get blown out and the bruised reeds get crushed underfoot. We wonder what justice is supposed to look like, and we might sometimes wish for a saviour that packs more punch.

Maybe that's why people's hearts were burning with expectation for John the Baptist. This mysterious figure had captured their imaginations with his message of repentance and the coming of God's Kingdom. Perhaps they expected something dramatic to happen. In order for God's Kingdom to reign, other powers would have to be swept aside. Some might have hoped for an overturning of unjust labour practices. Others were holding out for an end to Roman imperialism. Some saw the need to rebalance a volatile financial system that failed to provide for human needs. Still more might have seen John as the one to end corruption among religious leaders. Whatever their vision of justice, they expected something to happen, and for John to be the one to bring it about. So they lined up to be baptized, but John had some startling news: don't look to me; look for one more powerful who is to come. Already there, baptized alongside them, was Jesus, filled with the Spirit and lighted by God's love. God sent no mere servant, but his own beloved child. He established justice, not in our systems and institutions, but in our hearts.

Refugee Sponsorship Update:

In case you missed this information when it was published before Christmas, St. John Brebeuf Parish has teamed up with St. Paul the Apostle to begin sponsorship of a refugee family. This is a big commitment for both of our parishes. There is a lot of energy around refugee sponsorship right now, but our commitment to this ministry must persist after the headlines have subsided and other crises call out for our attention. A committee made up of members of both parishes has met and is working on taking the next steps towards sponsorship—namely to secure the paperwork necessary for sponsorship and to set up the necessary groups who will be responsible for all aspects of resettlement. Our parishes will be responsible for all the needs of the family during their first year. This means providing housing, clothing, food, medical/dental/eye care, education, transportation, employment and skills development, personal finance, and social/leisure. Each area

will need a subcommittee. Our plan is to put one person from the main sponsorship committee as the contact person for each subcommittee, who will then recruit volunteers from each parish. Already parishioners are coming forward with offers of clothing and household items—there's nowhere to put donations just yet! Our greatest need going forward will be devoted people with open hearts and time to volunteer. Stay tuned for more soon.


