

January 10/11, 2015: Baptism of the Lord

Baptism of the Lord: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Acts 10:34-38; Mark 1:7-11

Watching the junior hockey final between Canada and Russia, I was struck by the energy of the crowd and of the players. Everyone somehow seemed more alive. The game seemed to be locked up in the second period as Canada amassed a 4 goal lead. A string of power plays and a couple of tricky bounces cut the lead to 1 in a matter of minutes. The Russians were certainly playing to win, but there was more to their play than claiming a title—they seemed to come back to life even as they faced a tough competitor. The Canadian players had a similar choice to make: roll over and die, or rise to the challenge. The match highlighted their skill, their drive, their passion, but above all else, it was a testament to life. It's truly amazing that the universe should come alive; even more delightful is when that life comes together to play. Before anyone was crowned champion, both teams exhibited the sheer joy that comes from being fully alive.

Our lives can sometimes feel like a sadistic game against death where the odds are never in our favour. Sure, there might be moments along the way where it seems like we've gained a healthy lead, but when the final buzzer goes, death takes everything—everybody—from us. It does so without prejudice for one's wealth, status, or righteousness. Death does not delight in our lives; it does not leap for joy, nor does it cry in pain over us. The real tragedy though is when we feel this way about God. Death holds a real power over us in a way that makes it feel like a god. God, however, is Lord of the living, and we do not seek our Lord among the dead, for he is risen.

As Jesus rose out of the waters of baptism, the heavens opened up and he heard a voice affirming him as a child of God, and that God was pleased with him. The reality of death makes God seem somehow displeased with us, his created, that he should want us to die, or at the very least doesn't care that we do. On the contrary, God delights in our lives so much that he wants us to keep living no matter what. As Jesus breathed his last on the cross, the barrier between heaven and earth—the curtain in the temple—tore in two, and a Roman Soldier cried out, "Truly this man was God's Son!" In baptism, God claims us as his children, so that death has nothing to take from us—we already belong to God. With nothing to lose, we can pull the goalie and play on against the certainty of death. We're not sure we'll win, but we can have faith that God will.


