January 11/12, 2014: Baptism of the Lord

Baptism of the Lord: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Psalm 29; Acts 10:34-38; Matthew 3:13-17

One of the best advertisements of 2013 was the Guinness commercial, "Basketball". The spot opens in a gym with a group of men in wheelchairs playing a brutal game of basketball. Sweat pours off their brows as they jostle for the ball. Their wheels clash and bodies tumble while the game intensifies. At one point, one of the players tips over in his wheelchair, and in a display of determination, rights himself using just his arms. The end of the game reveals a twist: only one of the men actually uses a wheelchair fulltime; the rest of the guys unstrap themselves from the chairs and walk as they all leave together. These guys don't need wheelchairs, but they choose to play their basketball game in them so their friend can play too.

This is condescension in a good way—these men humble themselves so everyone can fit in. Jesus displays a similar attitude to John the Baptist. John is reluctant to baptize Jesus; he recognizes Jesus as "one more powerful than him" who baptizes not just with water, but with the Holy Spirit. "If anything," John says to Jesus, "I need to be baptized by you, yet you come to me?" Implied is the question: why would Jesus need to be baptized? Without sin, he did not need to repent of anything. As God's anointed, he certainly did not need the recognition.

The movement that takes place tells us something of God's action. Jesus lowered himself into the waters of the Jordan, and as he did, the Spirit of God descended as well and rested on him. Jesus' baptism is an extension of his Incarnation—his becoming human. By entering our humanity so completely, the Spirit of God embraces him.

So often we might think that as a church we are supposed to lift ourselves out of the fracas of our humanity; that we are supposed to float above the fray as a community of holy people. Jesus' humility suggests that God works differently: God's Spirit embraces us in our human frailty so that we can belong to God's family. Our own baptisms are not being "cured" from our broken humanity: we could no more rise above our human nature than a friend in a wheelchair could lift herself out of it by simply trying harder to stand. Baptism is another time when God says "yes" to our humanity. The Holy Spirit comes down and straps in with us for the ride, saying, "You are my beloved, with you I am well pleased."


