January 18/19, 2014: 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time – Isaiah 49:3, 5-6; Psalm 40; 1 Corinthians 1:1-3; John 1:29-34

Church can be a comfortable place for some. Every Sunday, the trusty doors swing open with a creak. Friendly faces fill up the pews, familiar hymns hang in the air and the liturgy drifts into its measured cadence. In *The Trumpet of the Swan*, E.B. White used pleasing church experience to describe his human character's affinity for nature. "Sam always felt happy when he was in a place among wild creatures. Sitting on his log, watching the swans, he had the same good feeling some people get when they're sitting in church." Watching the swans, Sam felt connected to the world the way a warm church connects people to God.

St. Paul talks about church in his letter to the Corinthians as, "all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours." Our cozy little corner of God's kingdom is not the final word on church. Everywhere that proclaims Jesus as Lord is church too, even if their ways of connecting with God are unfamiliar to us. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (Jan. 19-26) is a visible reminder to us that our one God has many ways of reaching out to the world. Despite our differences, churches can get together because of the peace and grace of God given to us through Jesus Christ.

The fact that various Christian denominations gather together and pray might not seem like that much of a miracle, yet it is possible only because God has revealed his Son to us. We don't have to try to sell our way of doing things to the world or have to invent some product to compete with one another, because what we proclaim has been given to us. Like John the Baptist, we can set ourselves aside for the sake of the one who "ranks ahead" of us because God has shown us his Son. Jesus goes before us to show us the way: the way to reconciliation, to peace, and to a love that conquers even death. We encounter God when we gather together on Sunday, hear God's word, and celebrate the Eucharist. That we count among many others who have seen and heard this Good News in their lives is indeed no small feat. We can rejoice that others have felt this same good feeling on their own log, watching the swans.
