

## Third Sunday in OT: Jonah 3:1-5, 10; 1 Cor 7:29-31; Mark 1:14-20

Jonah knew that prophets often end up dead—when God's message was displeasing, the messenger suffered—so he grabbed the first boat heading the opposite direction from Ninevah. Jonah's resistance only served to further amplify God's resolve to have him go there: a furious storm engulfs the ship, Jonah spends three days and nights in the belly of a big fish, finally he gets coughed up back where he started. The author cheekily points out that God tells Jonah "a second time" to go to Ninevah. I'm sure Jonah knew enough not to make God ask a third time.

As a prophet, Jonah was remarkably effective. In a single day he managed to convince an exceedingly large city of a hundred and twenty thousand people to proclaim a fast and believe in God. God spared the city from the calamity Jonah had warned about. Rather than rejoice at the people's conversion, Jonah complained to God. Between the near-shipwreck, the three days spent in the belly of a fish, and the thousand-kilometer overland journey to Ninevah, Jonah had expected more to do when he arrived. Could God have not convinced the people of Ninevah to repent without having made Jonah go through all that hardship?

The irony is that the wicked town of Ninevah responded to God much faster and more fully than the pious Jonah, who said of his faith, "I worship the Lord, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land." God was clearly more concerned with the conversion of Jonah than with the people of Ninevah. The whole story has a cartoonish vibe to it: the Coyote expends enormous effort only to have the Roadrunner slip away without breaking a sweat. Poor Jonah must have felt like he ran into a brick wall with a tunnel painted on it.

Today's Gospel is equally confounding. We see Jesus, nonchalantly strolling the shores of Galilee, utter no more than ten words, and effect tremendous transformation in the lives of his disciples. Simon and Andrew immediately dropped their nets, while James and John left their father standing dumbfounded in the boat in the middle of the work day. There were no excuses, no speeches, no convincing, no flashy miracles; Jesus called and they followed. Our experience of discipleship is nowhere near this simple: it's marked with indifference, resistance to change, clinging to the past, and hardness of heart. Yet we gather here once again to hear what God has to say, because God reveals what we need to change. For every time our faith has hit the wall, God has shown up to open a door for us. When we aren't worthy to welcome him, Christ shows up just the same, says the word and we are healed. We might sit there wishing for more; or we can get up, follow him out the door, and see where he takes us. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate


