3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Isaiah 9:1-4; Ps.27; 1 Cor 1:10-13, 17-18; Matthew 4:12-23

Fishing was a fairly decent way to earn a living, especially along the Sea of Galilee. Sure it was physically demanding, but what line of work wasn't in those days? There was a thrill in catching fish—Simon and his brother Andrew felt anticipation as they hauled in their nets. Eager to count the load, they'd tease each other about who'd be first to come up from the bottom of the lake with the foot-rope to his net in hand. Then they'd wrestle their lines to shore, dragging their nets—hopefully heavy-laden with fish—behind them. Once the catch was in, there was the long, quiet walk to the market, where they could auction off their catch. Merchants came from near and far, so the fishermen had picked up a smattering of Greek and Hebrew. The brothers dealt shrewdly with the fish-hawkers; they knew which type of fish to sell fresh and which to sell salted to get the best price. They mentally tabulated the total from their nets in the firelight, the brothers discussed the dealings of the day and dreamed about saving up for a boat and hiring a crew, just like Zebedee and his family. When their own sons were old enough, they too would teach them to work the nets and count the fish.

One morning, Simon and Andrew got the sense they were being watched as they went about casting their nets in the lake. Sure enough, on the shore walked a robe-clad stranger shamelessly staring at the brothers. He was clearly not from around Galilee, for he watched the fishermen with a kind of fascination as though he had not seen men pull fish from the water before. The brothers had heard rumors of a would-be prophet who had moved to the area—a man who was said to show up at synagogue, teach the people and heal the sick. "Have you never seen a man catch a fish, my lord?" Simon teased the man. "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people" the man replied. Simon and Andrew were stunned. As the man walked off, they couldn't look at their nets the same way. How would this man make them fish for people? The world suddenly seemed much bigger than diving for nets and haggling at the market. They dropped their nets and set off after him.
