

## January 30/31, 2016: 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### **Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time:**

Jesus lost the crowd during his visit to his hometown. At first they saw him as a mysterious and powerful holy man—just the one they had anticipated—but then they recognized him as the boy who grew up down the street. They remembered the embarrassing things that happened to him: when he wet his pants in the First grade, that time he got stuck in a fish barrel, and how he had the worst acne as a teenager. Once they realized they knew his family, they were able to write him off for any number of reasons—Joseph and Mary were too liberal for some, others thought they were too conservative, still others knew them as "that" family who tried to hide shameful past. Hadn't Mary been pregnant before Joseph married her? Rumours abounded that Joseph had planned to divorce her, but didn't have the chutzpah to send her away. What a putz!

Someone finds out your family name, where you went to school, what street you grew up on, where you work, who you're married to, and they all of a sudden think they've got you all figured out. We do it to people all the time. Once we know something about someone, we can put them in a little box. It gives us a handle on over others so we can feel in control and superior. God, however, is not impressed with our classifications. Christ reveals our shared humanity so we can live beyond labels. Jesus used examples from scripture the crowd would have known well. There were plenty of Jewish widows in the time of Elijah, he points out, yet God sent the prophet to none of them but a gentile woman in Sidon. There were plenty of Jewish lepers too, but Elisha healed none of them except the Syrian general Naaman. God can work through anybody, not just those we consider legitimate.

The crowd was enraged at Jesus' cheekiness, and things started getting dangerous. It must have been scary for him to have confronted such hatred, yet I imagine him smiling wryly as they led him up the hill. Did he resist them? I think he might have played along, "Yes, by all means, show me how wrong I am by throwing me from a cliff. That will surely prove that you know how to accept prophets from your hometown. Here, I will lead the way." The irony of the situation might have given Jesus something to laugh at. When they reach the top of the hill, no one is willing to be the one to push him over the edge. They labelled Jesus, but he refused to wear the tag. He stands up to his accusers and shames them by revealing their vulnerabilities: they are more scared than he is, more insecure about their identity, less sure about their place in God's family. Jesus' faith in God reveals their humanity and shatters the barriers they would put up between people. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate




