

January 7/8, 2017: Epiphany of the Lord

Epiphany of the Lord: Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6; Matthew 2:1-12

The magi and Herod are a study in contrasts. Herod, the insecure ruler, learns of the location of God's anointed one, but opts to remain in his palace. He calls the three travellers from afar to a secret meeting where he plots to uncover the would-be usurper. "Go and search diligently," he tells them, "so that I may also go and pay him homage." The two-faced king lied easily, he sought to assuage his growing fear. A braver king might have joined the search, but Herod sat back down on the couch. Maybe he called for some food and wine to distract himself from his crippling anxiety.

The magi, on the other hand, were quintessential seekers—they left behind the security of home to head out into the unknown. They single-mindedly followed the path before them. They watched and listened for signs along the way, and when they were lost, they stopped to ask for directions—wise men indeed! They carried precious treasure that they laid down when they arrived, so they travelled home with a lighter load and uplifted spirits. God purified their hearts, so they could seek the Son with courage.

Our own search for God is a mix: part magi, part Herod. Like Herod, we might prefer some truths in our lives to remain secret and hidden. It's scary to live as though God were in charge—we'd rather maintain the illusion of our own control. God can go ahead and deliver the needy, but I'll take care of my own needs, thanks! We might have ourselves convinced of our own goodness, importance, or cleverness, even in the face of evidence to the contrary. It feels like we're unstoppable, but we're all one dead car battery away from being stuck. It's then in our powerlessness that God purifies our hearts, so we can find the courage to look to our Lord, not to ourselves.

It's not a comfortable process. It means leaving behind the palace couch and setting off on the road laden with the things we think we can rely on: our wealth, our beauty, our reputation, our pride and joy. It stings a bit to open up our treasure chests and offer those once-precious things to God's Son. Our knees creak when we bend down in worship before the true Lord of our lives—like an old athlete picking up a lost sport, the muscles get rusty when we don't use them. It's a journey we must make, for none of the things in this world can hold our reverence forever if they are not from God. When those boxes we carry turn out to be burdens, God purifies our hearts so we can once again place our trust in the Son—the Lord.




