

June 30/July 1, 2018: 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Wisdom 1:13-15, 2:23-24; Psalm 30; 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15; Mark 5:21-43

Blood was seen as the life force of every creature, and Jewish tradition held blood in special regard. Used in the right context—in the sacrifice of animals to God—blood was considered sacred. Pouring out the life of an animal served as an atonement for sins. Outside of sacrifice, blood was considered a source of impurity. It was forbidden to consume blood. The book of Leviticus distinguished between menstruation and irregular bleeding; it's laws separated the supposed unclean from the clean through rituals and practices.

Even in modern times, our culture considers certain kinds of bleeding unmentionable. In 2015, a campaign for underwear designed to absorb period blood was temporarily barred from advertising in the New York Subway because the ad used the word "period." The ads employed such "provocative" images as half a grapefruit and a cracked egg. Anyone who's ever ridden on the New York Subway knows these are the least offensive things you're likely to encounter! The ads were eventually permitted to run.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus met a woman with a chronic flow of blood. After twelve years of suffering, she had spent her last penny on medical treatments. We can imagine her growing desperate and trying increasingly radical treatments to regain her life. Perhaps she was the victim of quack doctors who advised expensive and ineffective procedures. When she heard Jesus was near, she didn't approach Jesus and fall to her knees like the synagogue leader did. She didn't ask permission. Rather, she came up behind him and touched his cloak. Her audacious act was immediately effective. She knew in her very self she was healed.

For his part, Jesus also sensed something in himself—a flow of power had come out of him unbidden. The scene strikes a stark contrast between the woman's strong intention and Jesus' apparent lack thereof. Earlier in the Gospel, Jesus had rebuked a storm to silence, commanded an unclean spirit out of a man, and was on his way to raise a young girl back to life. When we think of Jesus performing miracles, we imagine him this way: intentional and effective. Here we see Jesus poking around the crowd trying to figure out what happened. He only learns about the woman when she comes forward and tells her story.

The first reading provides some insight into what might have happened. God "created all things so that they might exist; the generative forces of the world are wholesome." God's life flows to us through Christ. Next to God's generous gift of life, power can't help but flow to us in our neediness and weakness. Like the woman, we can dare to reach out to Christ, not when we feel strong and successful, but when we feel broken and desperate. God's power works to restore us when we are most in need.

Archbishop Richard Gagnon is pleased to announce the appointment of Reverend Kelly Wilson as the Director of Synod implementation. (This appointment is in addition to his appointment as Parochial Vicar of St. Gianna's Parish in Winnipeg.) As the formal Synod came to a conclusion on Pentecost Sunday, the next phase will focus on making plans for the implementation of the resulting recommendations. Before

implementation of the resulting recommendations. Before the end of the summer, a Synod Implementation Committee will be appointed by Archbishop Gagnon to work with His Grace and Fr. Kelly to study the material from the Synod, to assist in the preparation of a post-Synod document and to set the priorities for the implementation of the Synod recommendations throughout the Archdiocese.

We are all aware that the means of communicating have changed rapidly over the past number of years, with the majority of people receiving their information via some form of social media. Many dioceses have restructured their Communications Departments to reflect this new reality, and there has been a precipitous drop in the number of Archdiocesan newspapers. Our recent Synod recommended that, as an Archdiocese, we review our means of communicating.

Effective June 30, 2018, the Archdiocese of Winnipeg will close their current Communications Office at the Catholic Centre and will suspend publication of The New Wine Press. Archbishop Gagnon would like to thank James Buchok for his service as the Director of Communications and as Editor of The New Wine Press. In the coming weeks, the Archdiocese will announce a restructured Communications Office which will focus on social media and other forms of communications.


