Reflecting on the Gospel: Matthew 13;1-23 Year A

When we are trying to explain something important to another, we choose our words carefully, speak directly and clearly, and pause often to make sure our hearer is tracking with us. Jesus always speaks something important: he is opening our eyes and ears to see and hear the growth and Life he offers us. But sometimes it seems as though he does not speak very directly or clearly. He speaks of the mystery of God's kingdom, of coming to salvation, in parables, and leaves us multiple layers of rich seeds to nurture and bring to fruitfulness.

This long gospel unfolds in three distinct parts. In the first part, Jesus tells the familiar parable of seed that falls on different kinds of soil; most of the seeds die before they produce fruit, but some seed falls on rich soil and produces an abundance of fruit

In between the parable at the beginning of the gospel and Jesus' explanation of it at the end, Jesus answers the disciples' question about why he teaches in parables. His answer actually includes a scathing judgment about those who cannot see or hear or understand the gift of salvation he offers. Some of Jesus' hearers have gross and closed hearts; others have understanding hearts leading to conversion and healing. Those whom Jesus judges harshly cannot nurture to fruition the seed of God's word he plants within them. Those whom Jesus judges kindly are the faithful who bear the abundant riches of the fruit of God's word. These are the ones who have open and understanding hearts. "To anyone who has" this kind of heart, he or she "will grow rich."

The third part of the gospel is an explanation of the parable, where Jesus explicitly connects the seed with "one who hears the word. Some hear but no growth happens. Others hear and the word is nurtured and produces good fruit. Both in the parable itself and in Jesus' explanation of it, he indicates that seeds falling on rich soil do not all produce the same abundance—some thirty-, some sixty-, some a hundredfold. God cares less about quantity produced and more about growth and Life coming to fruition. As we take in God's word with understanding hearts and come to conversion and receive healing, God actually gives us more than even a hundredfold. God gives us fullness of Life forever.

Winnipeg Harvest Top 10 most wanted items:

- 1. Canned fish and poultry– tuna or salmon (packed in water) chicken or turkey
- 2. Canned fruit and vegetables (packed in own juice)
- 3. Canned stew, chili, brown beans
- 4. Peanut Butter
- 5. Whole Grain/Whole Wheat Pasta
- 6. Baby Food– jars of chicken, beef, vegetables or fruit, infant cereal such as oatmeal, barley or rice, Formula with added iron
- 7. Rice-brown, converted or par-boiled
- 8. Canned spaghetti sauce or tomatoes
- 9. Cereal-high fibre, non-sugar coated
- 10. Canned Soup- lentil, pea, vegetable

Monetary donations are also gratefully accepted. Just one loonie allows Harvest to leverage \$20 worth of food.
