



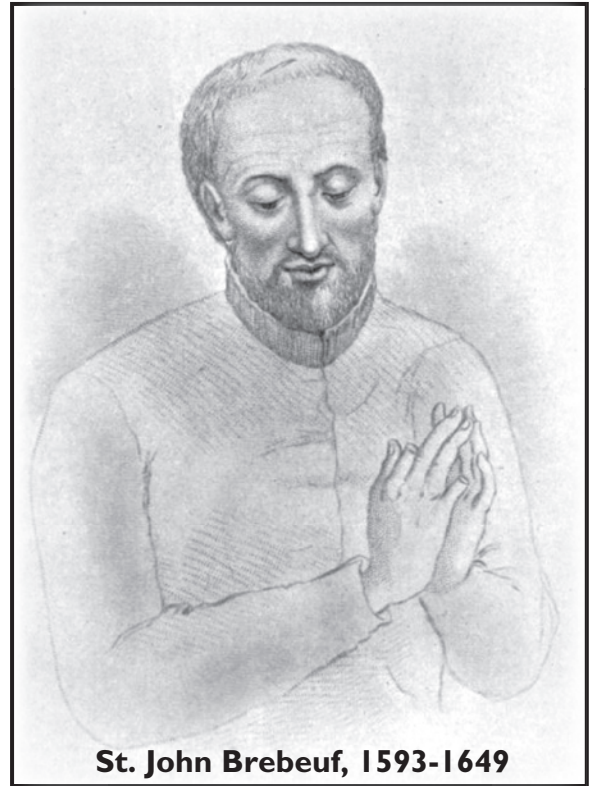

July 14/15, 2018: 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time: *Amos 7:12-15; Ephesians 1:3-14; Mark 6:7-13*

We speak metaphorically about our spiritual lives as a journey, but the disciples literally took a trip at Jesus' behest. As far as road trips go, this one strikes us as ill-equipped. The disciples left with few supplies—just a staff and sandals. They carried no purse or bag, no spare cloak, and no food. The missionaries would have relied on the hospitality of locals. They were more dependent on those they served than the other way around. Yet those itinerant pairs carried with them something vastly more important than food or protection. Jesus gave the disciples power to cast out unclean spirits.

When we hear the term “cast out unclean spirits,” we may imagine a dramatic scene with lots of screaming and writhing about. Talk of evil spirits might strike us as quaint and antiquated—mere superstition. The notion of spirits swaying our lives offends our modern sensibilities. Yet we readily embrace terms like mindfulness, wholeness, and well-being. Such expressions are friendlier for the mainstream. Underneath these sanitized terms lies the notion that our attention can be divided, our intentions can be clouded, and our sense of self can be fractured. This is diabolic influence—diabolic literally means to “throw through”—growing fissures that threaten to tear apart our integrity. These are the cracks in our psyche; those times we mean to do one thing, but find ourselves doing the opposite. Disintegration, distraction, and disenchantment—these forces slowly work to sour what were once sources of joy in our lives. One day we wake up to find ourselves in a place we never intended to go, becoming someone we never imagined to be, or doing things we had once hoped to avoid. These are the effect of unclean spirits.

In the face of these forces of division and separation, Christ stands perfectly united with God and humanity—One Lord, one God. We are many parts, so we sign during Communion, but we are all one body in Christ. God gathers the pieces of our fractured lives and unites us to Christ. There's a peace that only God can give, a peace that surpasses all understanding, and Christ unites us to God so we can live out that peace. Christ empowers us to stand united against forces that separate and divide. It's a power that we can cultivate in our hearts, in our homes, in our world. “Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place.” Jesus instructed the disciples to remain present to those around them, not to hop around dividing their time. When are pulled in too many directions at once, we can stop where we are. Christ will be there too. God's peace will pull us back together.

MASS ETIQUETTE- 20 THINGS TO DO AND NOT DO IN MASS:

3. When we enter and leave Church, genuflect toward the Tabernacle. Christ is present for our sake. By allowing our right knee to hit the floor, we acknowledge He is our Lord and God. If someone is physically unable to genuflect, then a bow is sufficient. During Mass, if you pass in front of the altar or tabernacle, bow reverently.
