

#### Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: 2 Kings 4:42-44; Psalm 145; Ephesians 4:1-6; John 6:1-15

A famine struck the land and devastated the people. A lack of rain drove away the animals; the crops shriveled in the fields. Elisha and his company of prophets encountered a farmer from away. The man carried a meagre offering of bread—small, flat patties, not much more than crackers—and some raw grain in a sack. Elisha ordered his servant to distribute the man's offering among the hundred people in his entourage. Setting such a paltry menu before the group was risky. In resorting to eating the offering, he seemed to confirm the deepest fears running through the camp. Their situation was beyond dire. Death was right around the corner. "How can I set this before a hundred people," the servant asked. Elisha risked destroying their confidence in him and in God. However, the meagre offering of bread did not run out, but satisfied their hunger with food to spare. The gamble wound up bolstering their faith, not their fears.

We live in a time of great abundance, at least materially, so the famines we face are more often spiritual ones. When we deal with sickness, unemployment, caring for our elderly parents, or even just trying to maintain our own mental health—times of difficulty deplete our reserves of faith. Faith is not the same as carrying on cheerfully despite crummy circumstances. Faith is no mere accident; it's an intentional act requiring enormous effort. Faith is the decision to act as though God cherishes our lives despite all evidence to the contrary. When we approach the altar here in our church, the minister raises the Eucharist in front each one of us and declares, "The Body of Christ." Out of faith, we raise our voices in agreement, "Amen."

In the meagre meal of Communion, Christ saves all the fragments of our lives we risk losing when we dare to have faith. Whether we come forward on Sunday with hearts full of confidence, or whether we have seen our lives crumble apart during the week, we will come nonetheless to raise our hands and receive the Bread of Life. The one who was broken, was made whole, and now gathers all shattered pieces of creation to himself. Christ saw in bread a manifestation of his own arc: chosen, blessed, broken, and shared for all. He offers it to us as a sign of God's faithfulness to us, so we can have faith in God. We dare to show faith, we risk placing our trust in God, because we are confident that God will recover any of the parts of ourselves we wager on faith. "Gather up the fragments, so that nothing may be lost," Jesus commanded after feeding the five thousand. The crowd that placed their faith in Jesus would not be disappointed. Christ confirmed their faith in God, in him, and quelled their fears. Gathering up the leftovers was an of love, a commitment that the broken pieces would not be left behind. We can dare to risk ourselves in faith, because God treats the fragments as precious and worth saving. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate
