

### July 29/30, 2017: 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: 1 Kings 3:5-12; Psalm 119; Romans 8:28-30; Matthew 13:44-52

An experiment was devised to test the economic model of humanity—one that believes people to be agents of rational self-interest. The ultimatum game had two subjects, a proposer and a recipient. The proposer was given a sum of money to divide between her or himself and the recipient however they saw fit: 50/50, 60/40, or even 100/0. The catch was that the recipient could reject the offer. If the recipient denied the offer, both participants left with nothing. Each pair only had a single chance to make a deal, so there was no room for reciprocation or bargaining. True rational self-interest would have the proposer maximize his or her reward, even at the expense of the recipient. A rational recipient would accept any offer above 0, since they would receive 0 for refusing. However, in practice, most people offered nearly an equal share of the money. Many participants rejected unfair offers, choosing to sabotage the benefit to the other even at their own expense. Rarely do humans behave with absolute selfish logic.

Two of Jesus' parables today describe the Kingdom of Heaven in economic terms. Buyers discover deals so much to their benefit that they rush to sell all of their assets in order to secure the prize. Perhaps we place ourselves in the place of the buyer and imagine what lengths we would be willing to go to in order to follow Christ into heaven. We might consider the real treasure in our own lives—we would gladly lose everything, so long as our loved ones turned up safe and healthy. However, what if the treasure in the parable is humanity, and God is the buyer?

It feels wrong to read the parable this way—traditionally, the pearl of great price is Christ, not us. We dare not consider ourselves to be so valuable. Nonetheless, God does indeed cherish us. So much so, that Christ paid the dearest price to make us God's very own. God delights in us so much, that God withheld nothing, not even the Son, in order to secure a place for us in the Kingdom of Heaven. If humanity is worth anything, that value is certainly hidden deep within. Yet God manages to seek and find our worth, like a buried treasure, and joyfully pays whatever it takes to make us God's own.

In the economic logic of the ultimatum game, God makes an entirely irrational offer to us, the recipient—here, take the whole sum! God pays it all for us to accept the offer. The stakes are high—all or nothing; life or death—so God tilts the scales to make sure we come out ahead. God scours even the last dregs of our humanity, like a dragnet sweeping up everything in the ocean. The bad parts of our humanity will be tossed out and destroyed—the sin, the insecurity, the jealousy, the greed. All the good, anything in us that bears the likeness of Christ, will remain. God saves all of our cherished parts, with great care so that nothing is lost.




