Least Coin Collection:


Each weekend, a second collection of pocket change will be taken immediately following the offertory. These funds will be used for our ongoing ministry of charity, beginning with support of refugees.

July 30/31, 2016: 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23; Psalm 95; Colossians 3:1-5,9-11; Luke 12:13-21

Jerry was not as proud of his 25-foot powerboat as usual because a half-million-dollar yacht had docked next to him. Jerry wished the yacht were his. Then he saw a man in a little bass boat admiring Jerry's craft. Jerry then noticed the yacht's owners gazing with envy at children playing on the beach!

Jerry thought, "If we keep looking for what is bigger and better, we'll never be happy with what we have. And we'll eventually end up wishing for what we could have had all along!"

"Vanity of vanities," says today's first reading, "All is vanity!" If we think that material things will make us happy, we will spend half our time trying to acquire things and the other half trying to protect them. And in the end they must all be left behind!

The gospel shows even more forcefully the foolishness of making material things our top priority. Jesus refuses to arbitrate a family guarrel over a will. He points out in a dramatic parable the folly of counting on wealth for security.

"Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth," admonishes Paul (Colossians 3:2). Material things are good, but they are not God!

Country of Origin: Syria Country of Current Residence: Lebanon Family Size: 5 Principal Applicant: Female (23 years old) Spouse: Male (34 years old) Children: Daughter (5 years old), Son (2 years old), Son (infant)

This Syrian Family of 5 cannot return to their home country as they fear for their safety. They are travel ready, and their estimated time of arrival is in 4 to 12 weeks.

Committees and Responsibilities

A number of committees are being formed to meet the needs of the family

Transportation: Providing rides and assistance. Registering for school, procuring health and social insurance cards, cell phone, banking set-up. Taking family to medical and dental appointments, shopping. Procuring bus passes, educating on bus routes, and setting up driver's education course. Driving to place of worship, if needed.

Housing: Searching for suitable housing, arranging lease & utilities, and acting as landlord liason.

Welcoming & Orientation: Greeting family at airport and helping them settle in. Educating on culture and basic laws, and connecting family with local and Syrian community. Following up with family and arranging leisure and social activities.

Medical & Health: Find family doctor, dentist, optometrist, counseling. Educate re: medical emergencies (walk-in clinics, doctor's office, E.R., 911)

Personal Finance: Teach family about budgeting, credit cards, credit, saving. Educate re: scams, help file income tax returns.

Education & Employment: Connect family with language and skills training resources, including NEEDS Centre for help with children's homework. Assist with networking and job search.
