Reflecting on the Gospel: Matthew 11:25-30 Year A

In the past few years our world has dealt with much destruction coming from tornadoes, hurricanes and flooding. The damage these storms do can only be predicted for a tiny bit of time before they hit, and sometimes they catch us totally by surprise. We have warning systems in place, and when the sirens go off we panic and seek shelter. The context for this Sunday's gospel is Jesus' judgment and prediction of destruction of towns where he has ministered. More than sirens, Jesus' warning gives us a whole lifetime to prepare for judgment.

What are the things hidden from the wise but revealed to little ones? The previous verses from Matthew's chapter 11 (omitted in the Lectionary) indicate that "these things" are the destruction resulting from being unfaithful to Gods "gracious will." Jesus "reproach(es) the towns where most of his mighty deeds had been done, since they had not repented" (Matt 11:30). The "little ones" are those who are unfaithful or faithful. The faithful, having come to Jesus and taken his yoke upon themselves, live in God's peace now. These faithful ones need have no fear of Jesus' judgment.

Scattered throughout this gospel passage are a number of contrasts that present us with the choice to be faithful or not: hidden//revealed; wise and learned//little ones; no one knows//reveals the Father; labour and are burdened//rest; unknowing// learn from Jesus; yoke//easy and light burden. The first term of each pair points to those who are unfaithful, those who cannot hear Jesus' message of Good News calling to them to repentance, those who call upon themselves a judgment of death. The second term of each pair points to those who are faithful, those who hear Jesus' message and change their lives, those who receive a judgment of life. The rest Jesus offers, the easy and light burden, is possible for the faithful because they need not fear Jesus' judgment. Jesus gives us shelter from every storm. He warns us of every destructive enemy. He yokes us to himself and assures us of Life and peace.

Winnipeg Harvest Top 10 most wanted items:

- 1. Canned fish and poultry— tuna or salmon (packed in water) chicken or turkey
- 2. Canned fruit and vegetables (packed in own juice)
- 3. Canned stew, chili, brown beans
- 4. Peanut Butter
- 5. Whole Grain/Whole Wheat Pasta
- 6. Baby Food– jars of chicken, beef, vegetables or fruit, infant cereal such as oatmeal, barley or rice, Formula with added iron
- 7. Rice-brown, converted or par-boiled
- 8. Canned spaghetti sauce or tomatoes
- 9. Cereal- high fibre, non-sugar coated
- 10. Canned Soup-lentil, pea, vegetable

Monetary donations are also gratefully accepted. Just one loonie allows Harvest to leverage \$20 worth of food.




