

July 7/8, 2018: 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Ezekiel 2:3-5; Psalm 123; 2 Corinthians 12:7-10; Mark 6:1-6

In the Gospel last week, Jesus felt power emanate from himself when a woman fought through the crowd to touch his cloak. Her faith healed her from a chronic disease. Perhaps her tenacity inspired Jesus. He pressed on to Jairus' house even though the child he was on his way to heal had already died. Jesus shared his spiritual power with those who had faith; he chased out the scoffers and the detractors from the house. It's strange to think of Jesus needing anything from those he served. We hold Jesus up as a kind of holy superhero. In our imaginings, he works miracles from a source of divine, not human power. Yet in Mark's Gospel, we see the faith of others helping to feed Jesus' ministry. This sense of shared spiritual power might explain why Jesus was relatively ineffective in his home town.

In today's Gospel, Jesus returned to his homeland. The locals were skeptical of him. They knew him to be a simple craftsman—not some learned scholar of God's teaching. Furthermore, they knew his family in and out. There were no prophets in that household. How did he come by his sudden wisdom? They were scandalized that someone as humble as Jesus would dare to speak as a prophet. They were so busy being scandalized that they missed the point. God had spoken through unlikely prophets in the past. God poured out the Holy Spirit on the weak, the humble, and the downtrodden. The Spirit lifted them up to lead the rest of us back to God's way.

St. Paul suffered terribly—he bore a thorn in the flesh. The nondescript wound may have been physical, mental, or spiritual. The fact that it is unspecified allows us to imagine our own shortcomings and sufferings the same way as St. Paul. God revealed his woundedness as the starting point for God's grace to work in him. God worked through St. Paul because of his neediness, not in spite of it. Through his weakness, St. Paul learned to depend on God for strength. So it's not unthinkable to imagine Jesus working the same way—he allowed himself to be made weak so that the power of God would pour out all the more on the humble of the world. When we are most in need, it is then that we find our faith is strongest. We can dare, like Christ, to bear our weaknesses, because God pours out the grace we need to strengthen our faith.
