

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time--Zechariah 9:9-10; Psalm 145; Romans 8:9, 11-13; Matthew 11:25-30

Imagine having to pick the wall colour, the furniture, and the décor every time you came home. Too much of a good thing applies to choice too, and unfettered decisions guickly become tiresome---it's useful to have some structure to our choices. A good story will have a form that is recognizable, so the reader doesn't have to figure out what's going on at each turn, but can instead become immersed in the narrative. A good character might embody an archetype; it helps drive the story if the reader doesn't find themselves wondering on every page if a given character is heroic or evil. In the story of our lives, we might-consciously or not-create or adopt a character type as a foundation for our experience. For Christians, the obvious character to embrace as the basis of our lives is Christ.

For the first disciples, following Christ was literally as simple as walking behind the Lord. We encounter Christ in less explicit ways than that. We seek Christ in the scriptures, finding the words He cherished and the stories that shaped His faith. Christ identified with Holy Wisdom as She is described in the book of Sirach. There is a passage that is similar to Christ's words in today's Gospel, "Draw near to me, you who are uneducated, and lodge in the house of instruction...put your neck under her yoke, and let your souls receive instruction, it is to be found close by." Wisdom is readily attainable to all, with little strain required. "See with your own eyes that I have laboured but little and found for myself much serenity." Jesus was coming from visits to cities that did not repent despite His works of power among them. He shamed the proud-for all their supposed intelligence, they could not recognize the Wisdom of God in their midst.

The good news in the Gospel today is that we need not rely on our own cleverness or rank to satisfy our hungry souls—God's own Wisdom lifts our burdens so our souls may rejoice in Christ. We often feel too busy, too weighed down with the responsibilities and cares, to make Christ the basis of our lives. Following Christ can feel like just another task that needs to be done on an ever-growing list. Perhaps the people of Chorazin and Bethsaida were too busy trying to run their lives their way to see that God already walked among them. We need not wait until we have checked off all the items on our list to grow into God's Kingdom. God's Holy Wisdom bears our burdens today so we can rest our souls in Christ. It's this easy yoke and light burden that allow us to grow into the endless love of God.
