June 14/15, 2014: Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity: Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9; Daniel 3:52-56; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18

Storming away from an argument is a perfectly normal human reaction. It may not be the healthiest way to cope with conflict, but sometimes it's the best a person can muster—at least it's better than throwing dishes. After leaving, there can be a moment when a person looks back hoping that whoever they're running from will come chasing after. It's a moment of vulnerability wedged in the middle of a defiant display of superiority. How often have we deserted God, thinking we'd be better off on our own? Worse even still are those times we've felt like it's been God who has walked out on us. Yet in these moments God stretches out to hold us even closer.

The Hebrew people were no strangers to vacillating in and out of God's favour. Rescued from slavery in Egypt, they exercised their newfound freedom by complaining about the food and wishing for an idol to worship. It would be easy to imagine that God would be enraged and abandon his people to their own devices. Instead, God gives his people a second chance, inscribing for them once more the commandments he had given to Moses. What may have been a bitter end to God's relationship with his people became instead a jumping off point for God's boundless love and forgiveness.

The mystery of God's endless love is the heart of our belief in the Holy Trinity. God is by nature, a relationship—God is love itself. It is easy to believe that God is capable of this kind of love, but it still comes as a surprise that we—as stiff-necked as any Israelite—are somehow able to receive this love. The world may keep running away from this love, stomping away to escape it. God keeps stretching out to hold onto us when we think we're unfit for love. The real mystery of the Trinity is how something so perfect and pure can be the destination of both saints and sinners. So there we are, standing outside with folded arms, looking back to the door in our smug self-righteousness, too frozen with pride and fear to go back inside, convinced we wouldn't be welcome even if we did try to return. We wait with irrational hope that maybe, just this last time—really—God will come out after us, once again. It's at those times that God bursts through "with arms stretched out between heaven and earth" to hold us closer than we ever thought possible.

Ordinary Time:

In his apostolic letter approving the Roman calendar (14 February 1969), Pope Paul VI noted some important facts about the liturgical year:

- Over many centuries, Catholics had become accustomed to so many special religious devotions that the mysteries of redemption lost their proper place. This was due to the large number of vigils, holydays and octaves, and to the growing dominance of various seasons over the Church year;
- + St. Pius X and St. John XXIII restored Sunday to its former dignity, so that everyone should once more consider it as the Church's original feast day;
- The popes restated the traditional teaching of the Church: The celebration of the liturgical year has a special sacramental power and force which nourishes and strengthens the life of Christians. The Church year is not merely a recalling of the historical events by which Christ won our salvation;
- The reason for the restoration of the liturgical year is to help believers through their faith, hope and love to share more fully in the entire mystery of Christ as it is unfolding throughout the year.


