Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

To err is human, to forgive is divine. Few of us would argue this wisdom, but none of us has been perfect in our observance! When the hurt is deep, the pain tends to be lasting, and it easily freezes over into hostility and bitterness.

The author of the Second Book of Samuel reviews God's graciousness to David. The Lord gave David the throne of King Saul, Saul's wives, and the united kingdom of Israel and Judah. In return David commits adultery with Bathsheba and murders her husband, Uriah. David's offenses were punishable by death (Exodus 20:13-14). Instead there is divine forgiveness. "The LORD has put away your sin; you shall not die" (2 Samuel 12:13).

Psalm 32 deals also with human sinfulness. The psalmist urges us to follow the example of a God who immediately bestows favor upon the one who admits guilt and asks forgiveness. The God of this psalm is not the celestial bookkeeper meticulously tabulating sins; rather, God is shelter and protector. "Happy are those whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered" (Psalm 32:1).

Luke illustrates heavenly forgiveness in the story of the Pharisee and the repentant woman. The Pharisee would establish a kingdom of borders where the righteous are set apart from the sinners. Jesus, the invited guest, teaches about the heavenly kingdom where division is demolished by forgiveness.

The repentant woman enjoys a clearer vision than does the righteous Pharisee. The latter is able to recognize Jesus as a rabbi and perhaps a prophet, yet he overlooks traditional signs of Near Eastern hospitality. The woman sees Jesus as one who forgives and welcomes him by anointing his feet. She embraces the protocol of God's kingdom where there are no divisions.

Our attitude must be Christ's. Where we have allowed hurt and pain to become bitterness and division, we must break down the barriers and embrace especially those most in need of forgiveness. The Pharisee has no place in our hearts. To forgive is to love and to love is to live in Christ and the kingdom.


