

June 16/17, 2018: 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: Ezekiel 17:22-24; Psalm 92; 2 Corinthians 5:6-10; Mark 4:26-34

Jesus first arrived on the scene proclaiming the good news that the Kingdom of God unfolds in our midst, so repent and have faith. This may sound like bad news to our ears—an ultimatum to shape up or ship out. The Gospel today sees Jesus compare the Kingdom of God to the gradual development of a grain crop. The seed is sown and a shoot eventually emerges, but the grain is not ready for harvest just yet. The Kingdom of God is not a deadline to meet our faith quota, but a process of growth that produces faith in abundance. God will not cut down the stalk before the grain is ready. Rather, Christ nurtures us while we are still growing, so we produce a harvest to share God's love with the world.

All too often we church-folk get hung up on the finished product, rather than the process of growing. If we're honest, each of us are unfinished in the eyes of God, still growing into the love and freedom that Christ has in store for us. Yet we can often be hard on ourselves, or others, for showing up to church incomplete and unfinished. Families can feel judged if they don't get their children baptized at the right time, or if their church attendance has been spotty. More and more, Catholics are getting married on the beach or outside at the lake—and they're even marrying non-Catholics! Some of us are tempted to despair at this sign of the Church's crumbling influence in people's lives. God is at work nurturing us to grow more than we might imagine we're capable of. So we can hold back with our sickles and wait patiently with the faith that God has something bigger in store for each of us.

Usually we're able to extend that courtesy to other people—most of us will gladly withhold judging others so harshly. Yet when it comes to our own lives, we can find ourselves staring out the window frustrated with how slowly our own crop is coming in. The growth that God has in store for us is invisible to the naked eye moment to moment. Growing a tree out of a mustard seed takes time. Day by day, it feels like nothing has changed. But month by month, year by year, a massive tree emerges from that vulnerable seed. God does not write off the seed for not yet being a tree, but carefully tends to the seed so that it might become more than it is now. We can be patient and take hope that the seeds of faith God nurtures in our lives will one day provide shelter for us and others in our time of need.
