The Art of Rasen Haddad:

"On August 6, 2014, after evening Mass on the Feast of the Transfiguration, the Christian residents of Qaraqosh, Iraq, were threatened by (the so-called) Islamic State to convert



them to Islam, pay a tax or be killed. That prompted the exodus of the city's 50,000 Christians, who fled to Erbil, the capital of Iraqi Kurdistan, with nothing but the clothes on their backs." National Catholic Register

Rasen Haddad is an Iraqi refugee from Qaraqosh now living in Jordan. He is an artist/art teacher who studied at Mosul University. His art, created mostly with pens because of the difficulty of obtaining oil or acrylic colours, is currently on display in our main church entrance. His work depicts the three parts of his story— before, during and after the crisis. Haddad left Iraq in 2013 and fled to Jordan with his wife, Shahad. They will be relocating to their new home in Melbourne, Australia later this month.

June 18/19, 2016: 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Zechariah 12:10-11; Psalm 63; Galatians 3:26-29; Luke 9:18-24

Identity is not as simple as showing a driver's license or a credit card. Life is a seeking to understand the person I call "me." The journey is long because of frequent detours. We seek identity in our successes, our accomplishments, our triumphs. The challenge is to break free of the gravitational pull of our own egos. Today's readings recommend that we look beyond ourselves to one who gave us existence in the first place.

The psalm tells of one who turns to God for help rather than relying on his own strengths. He is confident that by dwelling in God's presence meaning will be given to human existence. "My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me" (Psalm 63:8).

Paul issues our ID in the Galatians passage: We are of God because of our faith in the person and teaching of Christ. This is an emancipation proclamation. There are no differences based on ethnic origin (Jew or Greek), social status (slave or free), or sexual difference (male or female). Barriers that divide humans are obliterated because all are made one in Jesus.

"Who do the crowds say that I am?" is Jesus' identity question in the gospel (Luke 9:18). The answer given by Luke combines the Messiah image with that of the Suffering Servant. Jesus will be the Messiah only when he lays down his life for others. Jesus' identity is found in doing the will of God. Luke applies the same principle to us as disciples. Our true identity and purpose is found in going beyond ourselves. This is a daily task, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). If we lose our life for Christ, we find it!

The search for meaning and identity involves many paradoxes. All of the readings today point that out and so may leave us somewhat shaken and intimidated. The basic message is simply this: When asking "Who am I?" look to the other. We must give up our self-sufficiency and accept our interdependence. If we lose ourselves in meeting the needs of others, then we discover who we really are -- one in the Body of Christ.

Committees and Responsibilities

A number of committees are being formed to meet the needs of the family

Transportation: Providing rides and assistance. Registering for school, procuring health and social insurance cards, cell phone, banking set-up. Taking family to medical and dental appointments, shopping. Procuring bus passes, educating on bus routes, and setting up driver's education course. Driving to place of worship, if needed.

Housing: Searching for suitable housing, arranging lease & utilities, and acting as landlord liason.

Welcoming & Orientation: Greeting family at airport and helping them settle in. Educating on culture and basic laws, and connecting family with local and Syrian community. Following up with family and arranging leisure and social activities.

Medical & Health: Find family doctor, dentist, optometrist, counseling. Educate re: medical emergencies (walkin clinics, doctor's office, E.R., 911)

Personal Finance: Teach family about budgeting, credit cards, credit, saving. Educate re: scams, help file income tax returns.

Education & Employment: Connect family with language and skills training resources, including NEEDS Centre for help with children's homework. Assist with networking and job search.
