

June 20/21, 2015: 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Job 38:1-4, 8-11; 2 Corinthians 5:14-17; Mark 4:35-41

Jesus and his disciples stood at the shore of the lake, surrounded by crowds of admirers and inquirers. His strange words about the Reign of God had sparked their imaginations: how could God, so infinite and powerful, rule over a kingdom the size of a seed? They had many other questions about his teachings, but it was starting to get late, and Jesus looked exhausted. He told his friends to get the boat ready once more, this time to sail all the way across the lake. The gathering clouds filtered the low evening light—the setting sun's rays skipped off the water's surface and rippled slowly around the boat. A cool breeze off the water gently rocked the disciples as they set off. Jesus lay in the stern and closed his eyes, listening to the splash of the oars against the water and the whipping of the sail in the wind.

The weather changes quickly on a lake the size of the Gennesaret. About midway through the journey, the wind picked up speed, and the clouds began to roil and churn. Lightning flashes revealed white caps on the dark waves. The disciples tensed: the lazy pace of the oarsmen grew frantic; the helmsman sawed away at the till, this way and that, trying to break the bow through the crests; the rest were busy furling the sail, their hands shook as they alternated between tying and holding on. Jesus remained still—his cushion absorbed the motion of the tossing boat and clung to his frame like clay.

The storm was getting the best of the sailors. Water began to spill over the rails. The disciples could feel the boat bogging down. They were no longer pushing over the waves, but under them. The lake was 100 meters deep; the thought of sinking that far down terrified them. They were angry that he hadn't flinched even as they were about to die. They shook Jesus awake and cried to him. Immediately Jesus stood up and yelled at the wind and water, "Be still!" The waves settled down and the wind stopped. The boat drifted quietly to a stop over the perfect glassy surface of the lake. The air stood motionless around the flabbergasted disciples. They hadn't recognized the one in the boat with them as The One who "shut in the sea with doors... made the clouds its garment... and said, 'here shall your proud waves be stopped."

The disciples had been upset that Jesus had told them to go across the lake in the first place, but they realized then that God had gotten in the boat with them. He hadn't asked them to go to the other side, he had told them—it was as much a command as a promise. God doesn't ask us to go through turmoil without getting in the boat with us first. What storms could we face, knowing by faith who we have at our side?


