

#### June 23/24, 2018: The Nativity of St. John the Baptist

#### Nativity of John the Baptist: Isaiah 49:1-6; Psalm 139; Acts 13:22-26; Luke 1:57-66, 80

Elizabeth and Zechariah had given up hope that they could conceive. They weren't getting any younger when they were surprised to find themselves expecting a child. Since this pregnancy was already unlikely, surely it was downright impossible that they would hope to have another. For all intents and purposes, this pregnancy would result in their only child. So when it came time to name their only son, their relatives looked on expecting them to choose a name carefully from their family to pass on to the next generation and beyond. Zechariah was a priest of the order of Abijah, and Elizabeth traced her lineage to the house of Aaron, the high priest and Moses' spokesman. Their family had serious ties to Jewish history, so their son's name ought to have honoured their rich heritage. The relatives and neighbours simply assumed the couple would name their son after his father. So when Elizabeth announced that his name would be John, everyone was more than a little caught off guard. In a dramatic scene, they turn to Zechariah for clarification. He had been struck mute from his encounter in the temple with the angel Gabriel, so they bring him a writing tablet. To their amazement, he simply wrote, "His name is John."

The name John means, "God has been gracious." When Zechariah's mouth was finally opened after remaining silent the whole pregnancy, he began to praise God and prophesy God's coming salvation for all those darkness and fear. Those gathered around them recognized the significance of these events—God's power was active in their very midst.

God's power shapes our lives in surprising ways. Through the eyes of faith, we can see in the course of our lives God's graciousness unfolding. Rain drops gathering on a window pane suddenly reach a threshold where they no longer cling to the surface, but race down as rivulets, darting to and fro unpredictably. God's grace poured into our lives also builds and grows until one day it surprises us with a new direction. As we advance in age, we might try to pass weary cynicism for wisdom. We've seen this story before and we know how it ends. So we think, until we find ourselves struck silent as God's grace takes us down a path we would not have imagined for ourselves. Elizabeth and Zechariah found themselves suddenly swept along by God's graciousness. Their lives took a new direction that astounded their friends and family. When we too find ourselves driven forward in new ways, we too can look for God's graciousness carrying us along. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate
