

## June 27/28, 2015: 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Wisdom 1:13-15, 2:23-24; 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15; Mark 5:21-43

The story of the Fall, good old Adam and Eve, usually goes something like this. God made the first humans to live in a wonderful paradise forever, so long as they could keep their mitts off the forbidden fruit. Goaded by the tricky serpent, the humans became convinced that God was holding back on them. Chests swollen with pride, they consumed what they thought would make them become like God. This act of disobedience ended the perfect harmony of life in the garden and brought evil and death into the world. Human life became marked by toil and hardship. The way to eternal life was blocked off.

Some interpretations of Genesis fault human pride for the Fall. Today's first reading, however, puts a twist on the familiar tale—it emphasizes the relative innocence of the humans, "through the devil's envy death entered the world" (Wisdom 2:24). Like a little brother bribed into taking the blame for breaking grandma's collectable chinaware, Adam and Eve didn't know what they were getting into. The devil was jealous that God had lent the divine image and likeness to mere creatures. So he set up the humans to fail in an attempt to prove God wrong—to show how misplaced God's generosity had been. To the devil's chagrin, this wicked prank had the opposite effect on God's plan. Rather than withdraw further affection, God's efforts to connect with humanity increased exponentially, ultimately finding it's pinnacle in the person of Christ. What was snatched away by the Fall, was restored by Jesus' generous undertaking.

In the Gospel, we encounter two people embroiled in despair. The first is the woman suffering from severe bleeding for 12 years. She spent every penny she had on treatment only to end up worse; now she was at the end of her rope. Hearing that Jesus was passing through, she dared to reach out and touch his cloak, believing that she could be made well. Where Eve had reached out to grasp at the fruit that would lead to death, this woman clasped onto the source of life itself. Even in the face of despair, she chose to act bravely out of faith. The second is Jairus the synagogue leader who sought out healing for his daughter. As he brought Jesus to his home, we learn the bad news that the young girl has died. The practically-minded messengers tell Jairus not to trouble Jesus any further since he was too late. Perhaps Jesus had been inspired by the audacity of the woman with the haemorrhage not to give up, because he pressed ahead to the home. He runs into mourners, declares the child not dead, but asleep, and kicks them out of the house. Jesus, the source of eternal life, reached out to the dead girl, grabbed her by the hand, and pulled her up out of death. God shares divine power with us, so we can act courageously, even in the face of despair.

## From the Archbishop's Office:




