

June 2/3, 2018: Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ: Exodus 24.3-8; Hebrews 9.11-15; Mark 14.12-16, 22-26

Alex works as a nurse in intensive care. For him, coming to church is a peaceful break from the hectic hospital environment. More than that, it helps him cope with some of the traumatic things he's had to see. While he watches a family say goodbye to their sister who suffered a fatal drug overdose, or maybe while he cares for a young man who lost his arm in an accident, the words he hears so often on Sunday will pop into his head, "This is my body, which will be given up for you." As he approaches the altar in the communion line, his mind wanders to the people who have been under his care that week. He places one hand over the other and lifts them up—not only to receive Eucharist, but to bring to God a prayer for his patients.

Tharamma is the mother of three young children. She doesn't get much out of church these days; among holding, feeding, and chasing her kids, there isn't much attention to spare for readings and prayers. When she can zone in, the parts she hears seem long and drawn out to her. She started to question whether it was worth the effort coming to mass anymore. She nearly stopped coming one day—her youngest was being especially vocal and she could just feel the angry stares. She expected chastisement when the older couple sitting in front of her family turned around, but instead they beamed at her and told her she had a beautiful family. Now she looks forward to sitting with Grace and Donald. Between the three of them, they keep her kids busy throughout mass. Tharamma now appreciates the chance to spend some time with adults during coffee time after mass.

Moses stood at the base of the mountain and looked out on the crowd of people before him. After a life of slavery in Egypt, they had their freedom, and it was daunting. Where would they settle? What kind of lives would they lead now that they weren't full-time servants? The possibilities were as endless as they were scary. They were eager to hear a word of direction from the Lord who had set them free. Moses read the commandments God had spoken to him on the mountain top. These laws set the limits that would shape them as a people—not just a people, but God's very own people. Their voices rose together as one, "Amen." Moses sprinkled blood from the sacrificial offering on the altar and then on the people. God and his people were one. The Eucharist we receive on Sunday is along this same vein. We reach up to God, but our hands are not empty—we bring with us our cares and concerns, our talents and accomplishments, our sins and our failures. Christ takes up our lives to God, so our hands are free to reach up and receive communion—our new life joined with God.
