

June 3/4, 2017: Solemnity of Pentecost

Pentecost Sunday: Acts 2:1-11; Psalm 104; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13; John 20:19-23

Voices that were once easily ignored or dismissed now have a platform in the mainstream. People were once encouraged to hide their differences; now we are finding encouragement to embrace and celebrate diversity. This awakening to the experiences of people from the margins stretches the fabric of our society. It challenges the supposed unity that once existed. Politically, this phenomenon has given rise to populist movements that have promised their adherents protection against the emerging reality of pluralism. We might sit back in our chair and cluck our tongues at the naivety of a movement that treats society like a room with a door that can simply be shut and locked, but that doesn't remove the genuine appeal that such a notion has. Even in our open-mindedness, there's probably some group of people that we wouldn't object shutting the door on in the name of unity.

What to make of our differences is a real paradox. Ignoring them results in a false harmony; uncritically accepting them pushes away others. The scene at Pentecost in the Acts of the Apostles saw a gathering of devout Jews from around the Mediterranean. Though they were all ancestors of David, they were prevented from understanding each other due to the many different languages they spoke. Yet, the Holy Spirit rushed in and rested on them, allowing the crowd to understand the group Galileans. The disciples of Jesus addressed the crowd and testified to the great work of God's power manifest in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. The group was not made to speak one single language. Rather, the Spirit gave understanding to each, so that they heard the apostles' preach to them in their own language. Their diversity was maintained, even as the Holy Spirit brought them together as one.

Today, more than ever, we gather in need of this same Spirit. God brings us together while preserving the unique perspective each of us brings. The Holy Spirit draws from our varied array of experiences to work for the common good of all, so we can enjoy true peace in our community. The peace that God brings is not founded on a glossy uniformity, where each disciple is molded the same way. Nor is God's peace a capricious free-for-all, subject to the fickle whims of individuals. We can offer to God the messiness of our lives, our conflicts and our failings. The Holy Spirit weaves these tenuous threads together, finding a place in our common story for each of our experiences. God places these alongside each other, so even the ugliest parts of our lives take on new significance. The Spirit spins the fraying ends together, so what seemed like a weak link in the chain suddenly emerges as the cornerstone of our renewal. So we can dare to listen to stories and perspectives we would rather shut out, because the Holy Spirit connects us together in ways we wouldn't have imagined.
