

## June 4/5, 2016: 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: 1 Kings 17:17-24; Psalm 30; Galatians 1:11-19; Luke 7:11-17

Many people today promote a positive mental attitude. Books, podcasts, and lectures hail the benefits of an upbeat look at life. The gospel is our Christian source of hope and promise. The readings today tell us to accentuate the positive and rejoice with those who overcome severe trials.

Today's first reading comes from First Kings. This book, together with all those from Joshua to Second Kings, tells the history of Israel. Elijah is the star of this first reading; he was a ninth-century prophet. Elijah encounters a desperate woman. She is part of a society in which females had little social status and less financial security. She is already a widow and now her son has died. Elijah prays, opening the door to a celebration of victory as the son is restored to life.

Reversal of fortune is also proclaimed in Psalm 30. In distress the psalmist calls out to the Lord, our God, who rescues him from the nether world. In a communal worship service the people celebrate this triumph. The one-time victim now declares, "You have turned my mourning into dancing!" (verse 11).

Luke's account has Jesus repeating the act of Elijah: He restores life to the only son of a widowed mother. This passage interestingly calls Jesus "Lord," a title generally applied to him only after the Resurrection. Elijah prays to God several times to bring about life; Jesus speaks on his own authority.

The witnesses to Jesus' compassionate response immediately celebrate this good news, "Fear seized all of them; and they glorified God" (Luke 7:16). This news could not be contained -- word spread quickly giving all people new hope.

Who among us does not know some obstacle or trial? Living constantly confronts us with seeming failure, failure that a positive and faith-filled view would recognize as opportunity for success and hence growth. Like Elijah and Jesus, we are able to tap the Lord's power and so turn our mourning into dancing.
