



March 11/12, 2017: 2nd Sunday of Lent

2nd Sunday of Lent: Genesis 12:1-4; 2 Timothy 1:8-10; Matthew 17:1-9

God told Abram—at the ripe age of seventy-five years no less—to get up and leave his country, his family, and his father's house. Imagine establishing a life for yourself for seventy-five years, only to walk away from it all. What would have driven him to abandon his land, his extended family, and the culture of his ancestors? God promised Abram and Sarai a share in the divine life—to live under God's blessing forever—and he trusted that promise enough to leave everything he knew. God drove Abram and Sarai from the security and comforts of home to strike out in search of a life that would echo into the future.

Leaving behind familiar surroundings to seek a new life is a timeless human experience, one that is lived out to some extent by each of us, but certainly among newcomers, refugees, and immigrants. The promise of a future is so strong that people will risk life and limb to cross the border in the dead of night, even during blizzard conditions. People are willing to leave their homes, their families, their way of life, to seek out safety and freedom for themselves and their loved ones. Many choose not to make the trip. For those who do make the journey, the benefits may not be realized for themselves in their own lifetime—the full reward of their sacrifice might only be reaped by their descendants.

Jesus took his disciples up a mountain and showed them the fullness of God's promise and the glory of their ancestry. His body was transformed before the disciples into a vision of the new creation, the divine life with God. Sharing that vision were the great prophets Moses and Elijah, alive and in the flesh. Upon seeing this wondrous sight, Peter suggests they hunker down and stay on the mountain. However, earlier in the Gospel, Jesus told his disciples that he would have to go to Jerusalem, suffer, and die, before the resurrection. The transfiguration was just a vision of what was yet to come, but Jesus still had to pass through suffering and cross the barrier between life and death before the vision could be fulfilled. However, Peter couldn't see past the pain and the hurt. He wanted to stay on the mountain top with Jesus in his glory and bask in the comfort of his great ancestors brought to life. It took a voice from heaven to shake him out of his domestic reverie and bring him to his knees. Christ walked out from his glorious transfiguration to comfort his friends. He brought them down the mountain, and led them onwards to Jerusalem. Christ breaches the boundary between life and death, so we can share in eternal life. We are the descendants of a promise God made to Sarai and Abram long ago, a promise that Christ fulfilled when he walked away from his divinity and embraced humanity through death on a cross. We have inherited divine life through the sacrifice of another. This Lent, we can dare to follow Christ through any obstacle, because the ultimate border has been lifted. ~Tom Bailey-Robertson, Pastoral Associate
