March 12/13, 2016: 5th Sunday of Lent

Fifth Sunday of Lent (Third Scrutiny): Ezekiel 37:12-14; Romans 8:8-11; John 11:1-45

The fact that there is something instead of nothing ought to take our breath away. From the beginning of the cosmos, to the time some matter wound up floating at just the right distance from a star to allow for a tiny part of it to start moving around and replicating itself, life is a miracle. Those first little cells chugged along and evolved into every living creature that grows, crawls, flies, and swims. One of those creatures—us—looked around and thought it would be better to drive than walk, so we built Hondas and roads and made up laws to regulate the traffic. Despite the beauty and fragility of our being alive at all, it still feels like a personal affront when our car won't start or when we spill our coffee on our new grey slacks. It's as though existence isn't enough. Sure, being alive is okay, I guess, but you know what would really be nice? A grande caramel macchiato with just a hint of cinnamon.

I think this attitude is what St. Paul meant by "being in the flesh." We can become dead to life, even as our bodies go through the motions of living. Sometimes this feeling creeps up on us slowly, unnoticed at first, until we find ourselves unsatisfied with our own spectacular existence and blow up over an inconvenience. Other times it is foisted on us by trauma and grief. The loss of a loved one can suck the joy and wonder out of living; it can make us wish that the universe had remained uncreated, just so that we wouldn't have to endure such loss.

We see Lazarus' sisters dealing with different degrees of "being in the flesh" as they coped with their brother's death. Martha put on a brave face and even makes a profession of faith to Jesus, but Mary's grief left her broken to the extent that when Jesus saw her, he was "greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved." Even Jesus, who is the resurrection and the life, was so shaken up by the depth of Mary's grief that he joined in their weeping. Yet even while our hearts are breaking, God infuses every moment with new life. We experience death, but we do not belong to it. We live not in the flesh, but in the Spirit of God who sustains us each moment of our existence. Jesus doesn't wait for the fullness of time-some event in the distant future-to raise Lazarus from the dead; he restored his life that very moment. God doesn't wait for us to figure out our grief for ourselves; the Spirit moves quickly to dwell in our hearts and bring us new life, even in the face of death. The God who raised Jesus from the dead will lift us up out of the tomb and unbind the knots of grief, so we can walk again in the light of new life.


