

Fourth Sunday of Lent: (Year A) 1 Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13; Ephesians 5:8-14; John 9:1-41

For the last three weeks of Lent, our readings will come from a cycle in Christian Initiation known as the Scrutinies. This week, Jesus heals a man born blind, who gradually comes to see Jesus as the Messiah. In the same way, our candidates and catechumens have been preparing to encounter Christ in the sacraments of initiation this Easter.

The airport is a great place to do some people watching. What else can you do while waiting to pick up your inlaws? It's fun to try to figure people out from afar. A few young men in boots and work clothes arriving from Edmonton were likely coming back from the tar sands; perhaps the cool down in prices have brought them back home for a little while. The sad-looking ones waited at the carousel for their luggage—had they been laid off so they brought more stuff home? The tanned lady sporting a Puerto Vallarta sweatshirt—well it's obvious where she'd been—but the two others she was with were harder to figure out; which one was the travelling companion and which one the driver coming to retrieve them? Both were pasty, perhaps she'd made the vacation on her own. That sounds lonely, but she looks too outgoing to be the type. Maybe her friends were still down there, but she had to come home early to look after her new granddaughter, whose mother was struggling to keep her asleep at night. More likely it's late and I'm starting to project my story on the people in arrivals. People watching is harmless fun, but it's dangerous to let initial impressions stand as lasting judgments. There is something holy about letting go of prejudices and taking a second look.

The prophet Samuel, on a mission to anoint a new king for Israel, was sent to the house of Jesse in Bethlehem. Upon arriving, he laid eyes on Jesse's eldest son, Eliab, and breathed a sigh of relief that the search was over. As soon as that thought flashed in his mind, a pang of doubt crossed over him: God's ways tended to be more mysterious and indistinct than this. Eliab's tall and powerful figure was too conventional; God's choices tended to be more surprising. Samuel passed over six more of Jesse's sons and suspected there was something he had overlooked. Sure enough, no one had even thought to call the youngest, David, over for inspection. God chose this shepherd boy to lead his people and Samuel anointed him in the presence of his older brothers, perhaps to their dismay and jealousy. God saw what the brothers did not—what was in David's heart—and that was worth taking another look at him.

Lent is a time for us to take that second look too, at ourselves and our community. Have we striven to do good, to choose the things that are hard, to make decisions that are unpopular but true? Have we trusted to heavily on our eyes, basing decisions on outward appearances or concerns that are not of the highest order? When we do, God throws mud in our eyes, not to hurt us, but in order that we might seek the light that comes from Christ. God sees what is in our hearts, so we too can take a second look and, gradually, come to see with the eyes of faith.
