#### March 24/25, 2018: Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

#### PUT OUT INTO THE DEEP: THE FIFTH AND FINAL SYNOD GENERAL SESSION

The fifth and final general session of the Archdiocesan Synod took place March 17, 2018 at St. John XXIII parish. In his opening address to the session, Archbishop Gagnon encouraged delegates to "think big." He compared the process of this session to the point of a spear: delegates were to discern the leading edge of the direction of the archdiocese for at least the next five years. He referred back to the Listening Sessions out of which three key themes arose: the formation of missionary disciples; the passing on of the Faith (especially to the next generation and to inactive Catholics); outreach to those on the periphery of the Church and of society.

At the Synod's fourth general session, delegates had worked with fourteen "global initiatives" as had been identified by the Synod Secretariat based upon the propositions approved by delegates from previous general sessions. On March 17, delegates, working in groups determined by the Secretariat, looked at which of the fourteen global initiatives were the most central to each of the three overarching themes. The recommendations of each group were submitted to the Secretariat who immediately tabulated the results (through a method that was not explained) and announced the top recommendations.

For the theme of the formation of missionary disciples, the top initiative was "We provide on-going training for clergy and lay leaders to equip them to provide formation for the people they serve." For the theme of the passing on of the Faith, the top initiative was "We support the vocation of marriage, and assist families in making their homes domestic churches by living out their faith and communicating it to others, especially their children." For the theme of outreach to those on the periphery of the Church and of society, the top initiative was "We seek to be a Church that accompanies others in mercy by being welcoming, listening to, and understanding their life stories."

The day closed with Mass celebrated by Archbishop Gagnon together with a number of our priests.

Of course, this sifting process does not mean that all other global initiatives and all other approved proposals will be ignored. Far from this. Although the work of the delegates in General Session has been completed, a final report is yet to be written and submitted to the Archbishop for his approval. Then, after that, implementation will be the duty of all Catholics in the Archbishop for parishes and in their other subsidiary organizations.

The official closing of the Synod will take place on Pentecost Sunday at a special liturgy held at St. Mary's Cathedral. However, the fruit of the Synod's work will continue through the efforts of the Catholic community in the strength of the Holy Spirit.
