

March 28/29, 2015: Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Passion Sunday: Mark 11:1-10 (Procession); Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11; Mark 14:1-15:47

To our modern ears, the word "passion" calls to mind a strong emotion or enthusiasm. Bob doesn't just like cars, they're his *passion*. Maria isn't satisfied with her relationship with Bob; she feels they lack *passion*. Isn't it odd that the term we use for romantic feelings and irrational affection for old Chevys is also used to describe the events of the New Testament concerning Jesus' betrayal, crucifixion, and death? We know that Jesus died for our sake, so we might think "passion" is used today to refer to God's immeasurable love for us. While this is not untrue—God's love for us is kind of bonkers—such an understanding misses the depth of what Christ's passion is and what it means for us. Jesus willingly surrendered himself to be executed on trumped up charges. He died at the hands of an indifferent imperial authority in order to appease the sensitivities of a corrupted religious establishment. His execution was cruel and absurd—empty of meaning.

This is what St. Paul means when he says that Jesus emptied himself. Jesus didn't die a noble death—leading troops on the battlefield in defense of a glorious cause or risking his life to rescue an innocent person. One of his closest companions handed him over in the dead of night and he was arrested by cowards, brandishing clubs and torches as though the same man they had listened to speak in the temple was some dangerous villain. The disciples abandon him in his hour of need. His trial was a farce: the eyewitnesses contradicted each other and no reason could be found to justify his execution. Though Pilate realized the chief priests were simply jealous of Jesus, he proceeded nonetheless. To add further insult, Pilate released a guilty man, Barabbas, before handing Jesus over to be tortured. Jesus was mocked and derided, crucified, and died in agony crying out a lamentation to God.

Could not the man who commanded the waves to be silent, who fed massive crowds of people with a smattering of bread and fish, who taught so persuasively and effectively, who healed sickness and cast out demons, have avoided death at the hands of an inept court and a spineless bureaucrat? This is Jesus' passion: that he submitted to the pitiful and cowardly actions of others for no apparent gain or benefit. He did this on behalf of all of those who will find themselves acted upon by powerful and banal forces, for all people who are trampled under the wheels of narrow-mindedness and apathy. Facing his accusers, Jesus clings to nothing except his identity as God's chosen child—the identity he received at his baptism. So, when we find ourselves acted upon by the powers of this world—when we too, like Jesus, suffer without meaning—God pulls us closer, embraces tighter, as his own children. Christ died a death without meaning so that our own deaths might be filled with God's abundant glory. For undergoing this, there is no greater name than Jesus.


