

March 3/4, 2018: 3rd Sunday of Lent

Third Sunday of Lent: Exodus 20:1-17; Psalm 19; 1 Corinthians 1:18, 22-25; John 2:13-25

The spiritual marketplace is crowded with many kinds of techniques that promise all manner of benefits. Self-help books offer fulfilment by sharpening one's mind and focus. Gurus assure their audiences they can find success in their lives by following their mystical insights. These practices run the gamut from the actually beneficial to the dangerously superstitious. Yet Christ offers something altogether different from mere personal or professional exploits. Christ's promise of eternal life is on an entirely different order of spiritual experience.

St. Paul recognized the radical nature of encountering Christ, "For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block for Jews and foolishness to Gentiles." Christ's big "success" was dying on a cross—by all worldly accounts he was a massive failure. Christ died a terrible death under the reign of an imperial power to satisfy the insecurities of some scrupulous religious leaders. Once he was "handed over" to be crucified, he neither acted effectively, nor spoke convincingly, to change the outcome. Christ revealed the power of God in his powerlessness. This paradox does not compute with our creaturely logic, where might makes right and winners take all. What kind of God loses so spectacularly?

As we continue during Lent to prepare for the celebration of Christ's life, death, and resurrection at Easter, it's worth asking what we think our preparations are for? Lent is not a season of self-improvement, to fix ourselves up so we can enter Easter feeling accomplished and squeaky clean. Christ revolutionizes our experience of God to prepare us for an existence unlike anything on earth. Lent is a time when we drive out the false worship and the distractions, just as Christ cleansed the temple, to make ready for an Easter of spiritual growth into eternal life. Even the most abundant success on earth can't compare with the everlasting Kingdom of God. So we can set aside the things that aren't eternal and we can look to encounter Christ in a new way this Easter.
