Fast and Abstinence Guidelines:



Fasting: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, those aged 18 to 59 should only have one full meal. Two smaller meals, as needed, but eating solid foods between meals should be avoided.

Abstinence from Meat: Those who are 14 years or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

1st Sunday of Lent: Genesis 2:7-9, 16-18, 3:1-7; Romans 5:12-19; Matthew 4:1-11

Moments of conversion propel the story of our lives. Things happen to us that change who we are forever. The birth of a child transforms a couple into parents. The death of a spouse turns a wife or a husband into a widow or widower. We are passive to some changes—they happen to us. Then there are moments of self-reflection, where we choose to change who we are. Realization sets in-we aren't living the way we are meant to, so we set about actively seeking to transform who we are. The lively exercise of agency distinguishes this kind of transformation from the type of conversion where an outside force acts upon us. Yet, at the beginning of any conversion, active or passive, is an encounter with the truth about who we are, a moment of revelation that can neither be contrived nor insisted upon. It's a gift from God to have the difference between our behaviour and our values revealed to us through the deepest stirrings of our spirit.

Lent is a time for us to open the door to welcome these moments of revelation, to prepare ourselves for God to change our hearts. We can be impatient when it comes to conversion. How many of us have set out to make a change and have wished for a magic pill to take to bring about the results without all the messiness of going through the transformation? The temptation to short-circuit the process of conversion abounds. In Genesis, the serpent tempts Eve with the promise of becoming like God. The instant transformation brought about by the forbidden fruit carried with it some unintended consequences for the couple. In a flash, they saw that they were not like God at all-they were mere creatures standing naked among the rest. Seeing with the eyes of God brought about shame and confusion. God intended to share the vision of God with humans, but in time, when they were ready. Seeking the result without undergoing the process ruined this plan.

Hungry and alone in the desert, Jesus faces Satan's temptation to once again short circuit the process: relieve your suffering, force yourself into God's embrace, seize the power and the glory and the honour that belong to you. Each temptation forgoes the process of God, one that relies on receiving the gift of God's vision, not insisting on achieving a result. As we set out this Lent to change our hearts back to the Lord, we may be tempted to kick up the stones in our life and demand God make them into bread. Instead, God lifts up our neediness, our weaknesses, and our sins, so that the very things which make us human might become the means of our transformation into the divine life. It's painful and humbling when God reveals these things to us, but we can trust the process of conversion because Christ makes the same walk with us.


