4th Sunda<u>y of Easter:</u> Acts 2.14a, 36b-41,1 Peter 2.20b-25, John 10.1-10

Huskies are known for being wanderers, and our dog Meadow is no exception. The first time we brought her to the dog park, she trotted off on her own and didn't look back. Despite our calling, shouting, and desperate pleading, Meadow was much more interested in chasing critters and sniffing logs than listening to us. So began months of training-releasing her from gradually greater and greater distances-that taught her to return to us. Though she's now been trained for years, it still makes me grin to see her run to me from across a big field: she bolts as fast as she can, ignoring everything in her way, with her ears pinned back and her tongue lolling about.

One might imagine God's despair at seeing us, his beloved creatures, drifting off on our own, with every manner of distraction drawing our attention away from God. It can be hard to know where to turn sometimes; God can feel very distant and removed from the immediate concern of everyday life. Even the glory of Easter joy can start to fade over the length of the season. The fifty days of Easter can be counted in many ways: that's four mortgage payments, three hundred work hours, one hundred and twenty five cups of coffee, and three tanks of gas.

In the midst of bills and schedules, God calls to us in a familiar voice. We can put these worries of our life into perspective because God shows us that which is truly life giving. The house is only valuable because of who lives there; work is only important because of the people it serves; coffee is best when shared with a friend; the real blessing is not having a way to get there, but having somewhere to go. God disarms the concerns that threaten to steal our joy and our life with a voice we can hear and follow. "I came that they might have life," Jesus tells his disciples, "and have it abundantly." The things that lead to life are what matter most; anything that doesn't can be put aside.

I imagine that God gets goosebumps at the sight of us following Jesus' call. There we were, stumbling about trying to squeeze life out of a paycheck or a shopping bag, when the words of our Lord pulled at our hearts. The words are familiar and the voice that speaks them is trustworthy. We can turn away from the worries that lead us to grief and despair because God has called us with the words of everlasting life.
