May 13/14, 2017: 5th Sunday of Easter

The 5nd Sunday of Easter:

Acts 6:1-7; Psalm 33; 1 Peter 2:4-9; John 14:1-12

For a piece of writing nearly 2000 years old, John's Gospel contains some parts that speak very well to our world today. Standing before the Roman Governor's headquarters, Jesus says that he came to testify to the truth. Pilate's retort—"What is truth?"—is a jarringly modern question to come out of the mouth of a character from ancient Rome. It sounds more like something Bill Clinton would have said while arguing about the meaning of "is". Our culture can sometimes be very skeptical; one that is more comfortable with ambiguity and irony than steadfast belief. Is there any room for those of us from this generation, so steeped in uncertainty, to seriously embrace Jesus as the way, the truth and the life?

Pilate wasn't the only one who struggled with Jesus' radical claim to the truth; the disciples were equally bewildered. Thomas said to Jesus, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Thomas wasn't being merely doubtful here; rather he displayed a depth of faith in recognizing the limited reach of our own human thoughts. From the prophet Isaiah, Thomas would have heard, "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts" (55:9). His question may have been moved by piety as much as it was by anxiety. Thomas might have asked how can he, a measly human being, even begin to approach understanding the way of the infinite eternal God? Our own moments of doubt may mask this type of humility: sometimes we'd like to believe, but we just don't trust our own ability to grasp the mystery. Taken too far, this kind of humility can lead to despair.

Philip's demand—"show us the Father!"—also sounds out of place for his time. Even Jesus is surprised at Philip's brashness. We are the ones who are used to seeing before believing, and trying it before buying it. After all this time, to hear this kind of disciple cynicism from his own shocked Between Thomas' woeful meekness and Jesus. Philip's hardened suspicion, what's a rabbi like Jesus to do? Ever the good shepherd, Jesus meets his disciples where they are at. If you can believe in me, then believe in God, Jesus says, but if you can't, then at least believe because of the works I have done. God makes enough room in his house for all of our quirks and baggage. There's nothing we can bring that God can't make room for. The things in our lives we think will stop us from entering God's house turn out not to be deal-breakers. We don't have to work out all of our faults before we can follow Jesus. God has made room to heal us even when we're at our worst.


