

different ways all the we communicating, it's astounding how difficult it can be to understand one another and to be understood ourselves. It is frustrating when the words we use don't convey our intended message, and when we miss someone else's point can be just perplexing. Communication is not always about passing along information, sometimes it is about revealing something of our innermost self to another. When our signals are missed, more than data is lost; it can feel like

Pentecost Sunday: Acts 2:1-11; Psalm 104; 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13; John 20:19-23

Imagine the experience of being a foreigner in an unfamiliar place: you might be surrounded by people, yet you are disconnected from the local language and customs. What is happening around you is not only confusing, but isolating. To you, everyone is a stranger, as you are to them. Unable to communicate, it feels like you don't even exist. It's no wonder that solitary confinement is one of the worst punishments a human can endure.

we are misunderstood on a deeper level.

The disciples knew something about being misunderstood. They had witnessed and had come to believe in God's amazing news: that the man named Jesus was God's beloved, the anointed one, came to break the bonds of sin and death, and to once and for all bring all of humanity into God's presence. This was a strange message, one that had been hard enough for them to understand, let alone pass it along to the rest of the world. Alone and afraid, the disciples locked the doors to the house and sat on this good news.

In the midst of their fear and confusion, Jesus appeared to the disciples. He spoke words of comfort and peace to them; breathed on them, giving them the Holy Spirit; and then he sent them out. The Holy Spirit melted away their fear so they could live out the good news of the Gospel.

One of the effects of the Spirit at Pentecost was to allow the disciples to speak effectively to people from all nations about God's power. Where people had been separated by language, the Holy Spirit broke through their differences, and all the anxiety and bewilderment that come from being strangers. The Holy Spirit dissolves our discomfort with those who are unfamiliar to us, so we too can understand one another on a personal level, and share the work that God has done in our lives.
