



welcome the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to visit healing and reconciliation. Earlier this year, the Holy

Father met with First Nations, Metis and Inuit Elders, Knowledge Keepers, survivors of residential schools and youth in Rome. The delegation was part of a critical step in healing and reconciliation that will continue this summer.

Specific details about the visit are still being released. It was confirmed that the Holy Father will visit Edmonton, Quebec City, and Iqualuit from July 24-29, 2022.

We are grateful for the Holy Father's upcoming visit and welcome him to our country in the spirit of walking together towards healing and reconciliation.

The Pope's Pastoral Works: May 22

This collection provides an opportunity for Catholics to make a financial offering to assist the Holy Father. One-third of the funds collected is for what is traditionally known as Peter's Pence: donations used by the Pope for his charitable contributions to those most in need throughout the world, as well as for the support of the Holy See and its activities. Two-thirds of the Collection for the Pope's Pastoral Works is to support the Holy Father in administering the Holy See and serving the Universal Church (see Canon 1271). "Each individual Christian and every community is called to be an instrument of God for the liberation and promotion of the poor, and for enabling them to be fully a part of society. This demands that we be docile and attentive to the cry of the poor and to come to their aid... The old question always returns: 'How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods, and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?' 


