

Pentecost Sunday: Acts 2:1-11: 1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13: John 20:19-23

There are inventory tests available that are designed to uncover any spiritual gifts a person might be harbouring. While this exercise might call to mind those silly online quizzes that decide stuff like which Bond villain you are, the spiritual gifts test is serious. The questions sometimes feel a little contrived—as implausible as what you look for when hiring henchmen or where you would hide your secret HQ-but actually going through the questions was something of an eye opener; the possibilities for God to act in the world are broader than I imagined. Has anyone ever been healed as a result of your prayers? I have a sense of praying for the sick, but I never gave too much thought that God uses some people's prayers to bring about actual healing. I can't claim to have experienced this, but others have and do. God acts through a variety of spiritual gifts for the sake of building up the community of faith.

Scoring a 0 on some questions is inevitable, probably an indication of being honest with yourself, but it certainly could feel uncomfortable on some questions. For instance, answering 0 to "When I see a person in need, I am moved to assist them." doesn't feel very Christian, but it's a distinct possibility. Some people are known for their personal warmth and hospitality, while others would rather eat glass than greet strangers. The fun part (or scary, depending on your gifts) about church is that God brings all these different people together to make something bigger than themselves-the body of Christ. No one part of that body can claim to be better; every part is needed in its own way for the common good. We don't have to have every single gift as individuals. We don't even have to like every single gift that other people bring. God sends the Holy Spirit to animate the gifts we need to build the Body of Christ here and now.

earthquake, 7.8 on the Richter scale, that hit Nepal during the night of April 24 and again May 12. Those lousy disciples sure took some convincing. Even after all that they had seen from Jesus, by the very end of Matthew's Gospel some of them still had doubts. Perhaps they were skeptical that this was all there was to God's master plan. It starts off amazing—enter into human history, teach people to love through word and example, suffer and die on the cross, rise from the dead like no one before or since. So far, so good; then it gets pretty weak. The entire plan hinges on sending out a handful of semi-dedicated followers to spread this amazing news to the whole wide world-all without cars or smart phones. It's understandable that the more practically-minded among the disciples were waiting for something more spectacular. Who would believe that same God who worked signs and wonders that freed a nation from slavery is now entrusting the most important mission of all time to the likes of us?

Like those early disciples, our doubts are often more about ourselves than they are about God. Who are we that we should have a share in telling the world good news about God? Wouldn't a flashy miracle or two be more effective? From our baptism, we know who we are, God's children. It's just hard to believe sometimes that God adopts us so we have a share in Christ's mission to spread the good news. There are lots of excuses to hide behind to shirk this responsibility; timidity masquerading as modesty ranks right up there. God's plan doesn't end with a hopeless band of followers, but with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to give us each the strength to call God our very own, just as God has called us beloved.

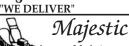
