May 25/26, 2014: Sixth Sunday of Easter

6th Sunday of Easter: Acts 8.5-8, 14-17; Psalm 66; 1 Peter 3.15-18; John 14.15-21

The crowds in Samaria listened eagerly to the apostle Philip—if not out of faith, than at least out of curiosity. The news that the Messiah had come would have sounded too good to be true, so they watched and listened to the signs that Philip did. They were trying to figure out what to make of Philip. His words and deeds not only convinced them, but brought them together so that they listened "with one accord". This term is an important feature of the burgeoning Church: it's used a dozen times in the New Testament, nearly all found exclusively in the Acts of the Apostles. It signifies the unity of a group, but it is not a passive sense of agreement. When we hear "one accord" in scripture, it means they rushed together, "out of breath" or "panting". The term showed up whenever the Holy Spirit was at work: when the disciples lifted up their voices to God in worship, when they gathered in silent discernment, or when they joined together to break bread. The Spirit boosts the church to live out the Gospel with vitality.

When Jesus was executed on the cross, he breathed his last breath and his heart stopped. The source of all life, the very Word of God spoken at the beginning of all things, was put to death and laid to rest. God brought Jesus back to life; raised him up to new life in the Spirit. Jesus shares this Spirit with us, so that we too can live a new life. It is through the Spirit that we can lift up our hearts to the Lord when we gather for Mass. We no longer have dead hearts; the Spirit raises them to life.

Of course, we don't always live with our hearts beating away, filled with God's love. It seems like all kinds of things stop the Spirit from making its way into our hearts. When things, big or small, don't work out the way we had hoped, it can feel like someone cinching a belt tightly across our chests until we can't breathe. When we fail, when we are in pain, when our relationships are destroyed: these are the moments that seem to stop our hearts. Worst of all is when God seems far away during these times. How can anyone lift up a concrete heart?

The Holy Spirit is God's jackhammer when it comes to stony hearts—it's a real heart-lifting expert. We know this because God raised Jesus from the dead. So, when we bring a dead heart with us on Sunday and are told to lift up it up, it is by the Holy Spirit that we lift them up to the Lord.
