



Here are some statistics that will be reported to the Vatican by the Archdiocese of Winnipeg this year:

In addition: in 2017 there were 162,000 Catholics out of a total population of 589,000. In 2017 we had 66 diocesan priests, 17 religious priests and 48 religious sisters.
