

From Father Wayne:

Updated Restrictions for In-Person Masses:

Entry and exit for all Masses via John Brebeuf Place only. The door will be open 15 minutes prior to Masses.

As of April 28 maximum capacity for faith-based gatherings has been reduced to ten (10) people. Reservations are required for weekend Masses. They are accepted starting on Mondays until capacity is reached: parishoffice@sjbcommunity.ca or 204-488-4467 (Ext. 210). We will not accept bookings beyond the current week. No entry without reservation please.

Do not come to Mass if you are feeling ill, particularly if you are experiencing a cough, fever or respiratory symptoms.

Please sign in (weekdays) or check in with the door greeter weekends when you enter the church.

Please sanitize your hands as you enter for Mass.

Please maintain **social distancing of six feet** (2 meters) between people while in the building.

Please leave your offering in the designated basket at the main church aisle when you enter the worship space.

Please limit seating to designated 'angel' pews. Unless you have come as a family unit, individual distancing of six feet (2 meters) within pews is required.

Once you have selected seating, please remain in your seat, except for the receipt of Communion. Parents, please keep your children with you.

Please exit as soon as Mass ends without pausing inside to chat.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we navigate the changing rules and regulations in place for the safety and well being of all.

The Parish Office remains closed to the public until further notice. All emails and phone messages will be returned as soon as possible. If we do not have your current contact information, please email or call so that we can update our parish records.

Mass Reservations:

Last weekend, several people who had a reserved place at Mass, did NOT attend. With our permitted occupancy being so low at this time, that's not fair to the many people who would want to come. Please don't make a reservation for yourself, or another person, unless who are very sure the reservation will be honoured.

Your offering will be deducted from your bank account or credit card once per month. Forms and further information are available at **www.sjbcommunity.ca**.


