

# November 11/12, 2017: 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: Wisdom 6:12-16; Psalm 63; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Matthew 25:1-13 An adult daughter helped her elderly mother clean out her house in preparation for a move to a care home. She filled boxes with items destined for goodwill: a smudged silver server set, boxes of dad's old clothes, a porcelain figurine of a dancing couple, and a dusty mantle clock. Her mother didn't protest the purge, at least not overtly, but she couldn't hide her heavy sighs and rolling eyes as yet another of her many keepsakes from her long life found its way into a cluttered box. The daughter was trying to stay cheerful as she coaxed her mother to let go of the old objects and get ready for a fresh start. High on a shelf, the daughter laid hands on an antique oil lamp. "Where did you get this, Mom? The Cave of Wonders?" She laughed as she carried the lamp over to a box. "Be careful with that. It's full," said the mother. She beckoned her daughter to bring the lamp over to her. The daughter was exasperated as she imagined the lamp starting a fire in the care home. "Mother, why do you have a lamp full of stinky oil?"

"Believe it or not, we used to use this lamp for light. Long ago, not everyone had electricity out in the country. Even when we did get power, we still kept the lamp ready, because a storm could easily knock out the lines. That's how my father died. He was out late trying to mend a fence when he got caught in a blizzard. The power went out, so mother lit this lamp and set it in the window so he could find his way, but the oil ran out and we lost him. Mother was never the same after that. She blamed herself for letting the lamp run dry. She had too many other things to do, she didn't have a chance to get more oil, and it was too late when the storm hit. From then on, she would stop everything to make sure there was oil in the lamp. Nothing got done unless there was oil for the lamp. I keep this lamp full to remember my dad and the lesson my mom learned. You're a lot like her, you know—always looking after other people. You work so hard, taking care of me and your own kids too. If you're not careful, you'll get caught in a storm without any oil."

The daughter sat down and thought for a minute. "But if I don't do them, who will do the things that need to get done?" "That's how my mother used to sound too, until she wound up in the dark. You won't do anyone any good if you run yourself down. You'll be as useful as a lamp without oil," the mom said. She pushed the lamp across the table to her daughter. "The wisdom you need is easy to find if you look. The light of Wisdom melts away the cares that darken our path."


