November 15/16, 2014: Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time: Proverbs 31:10-13, 16-18, 20, 26, 28-31; Psalm 128; 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6; Matthew 25:14-30

I commiserate with the so-called "capable wife" in today's first reading. It sounds like she is a successful real estate agent, entrepreneur, philanthropist, psychologist, and child development specialist. All the while, she maintains her "strong arms" without letting "her lamp go out at night." Does she ever sleep? Her productive happiness and cheerful achievements seem impossible, like the kind of "having it all" attitude popularized by the magazine Cosmopolitan. Women and men alike are simultaneously saddled and liberated by the loosening of gender expectations. Along with the freedom to follow pursuits once deemed appropriate exclusively for one gender or the other comes an anxiety to achieve things outside of our comfort zone. To be clear, I am not advocating for a return to "the good old days", as if there was ever such a thing. The frenetic pace of life is nothing new, and while at times it feels like it would be easier to hide from our potential than to risk failure, we are certainly tuned to measure our worth by our accomplishments.

It's no wonder, then, that to our ears Jesus' parable seems to praise productivity and chastise laziness. My relentless optimism hears this passage say that everyone can make something of what they have, so long as they don't bury their talents. All this shows is that I grew up watching *Mr. Rogers*. Jesus was aiming to say something more profound, and he hints at this cryptically, "For to all those who have, more will be given... but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away." God entrusts us with his Son—he gives us everything—so we can flourish with abundant hope. The boss has four servants, but only entrusts an eighteenth of his wealth to the last one—that one must have felt worthless from the start. Indeed, the slave calls the master a harsh man, as though resentful of being devalued. Who wouldn't feel that way?

Without God, we have nothing—what little we have will be taken from us. The good news is that with Jesus, God has entrusted us with all of his wealth. By giving us Jesus, God has already called us good and trustworthy. We can already live as valued children of God. Our worth has come from God, and nothing can take that away from us, so we neither have to protect our significance through concealment, nor achieve it through merit. If there is anything we can boast of, it is that God sent Christ to us, the whole bag of loot, holding nothing back. Since we already have Christ, we can hope in that impossible promise of "having it all." It's just that "all" turns out to be much more than we could ever hope to work out on our own.




