NOVEMBER 17/18, 2012: THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Some people see God as the divine architect who created the world and then left it to spin on its own independent course. Others imagine God as the celestial administrator who records debits and credits. Today's readings portray a God who is far from aloof, the Creator who takes on the problems of the created.

The passage from Daniel is written against the background of the persecution of the Syrian king, Antiochus IV Epiphanes (about 165 B.C.). The forces of evil seem to have the upper hand, yet these verses offer hope. The elect will escape, the dead will come back to life. For the author's community, this God is a caring God.

Psalm 16 is a psalm of trust or confidence. The God of this psalm is the portion and cup who has no choice but to provide and protect. Even in the face of possible death, the psalmist has no doubt that God will offer security.

Mark 13 is often called the "little apocalypse." Like Daniel 7-12 and the Book of Revelation, it focuses on a world of persecution. Jesus' farewell speech deals with two realities: Jesus will fulfill the Old Testament texts about the end and the disciples are not to worry about the precise time of Jesus' second coming. Like Daniel's Son of Man, Jesus will return and gather the chosen from the farthest bounds of earth and sky.

In the period between Jesus' Ascension and Second Coming, the task of the believer is to reveal a caring God. The follower who reaches out to the needy projects a God who is real. Our God is much more than a divine architect or a celestial administrator; our God is our hope.

VOICE OF THE ASSEMBLY: The primary instrument for the liturgy is not the organ or the piano or the guitar but the voice of the assembly. In fact, the singing assembly is the most beautiful sound that the liturgy can make. Usually it is not a polished sound, and can even be an out-of-tune sound. But when it is authentic and resounding, it is the only measure of whether our music is prayer or not. Nothing ever guite matches the full, alive sound of the whole congregation joining together in the praise of God. The word that best describes that event is "Alleluia." Alleluia is a Hebrew word that translates "God's people praise God." This special song of praise is used at many different times and in many different ways, but it is especially at the time immediately before the proclamation of the Gospel that it becomes an acclamation, a kind of shout for joy-always joyful, always sung. copyright @ 2010 Resource Publications, Inc.
