

Dear Pastors, Parish Administrators and Parishioners of the Archdiocese of Winnipeg,

I write to you as a follow-up to my letter, dated, April 10, 2018, regarding Development and Peace. In that letter I explained that the collected funds during the *Share Lent Campaign* in the spring of 2018, were to be temporarily withheld due to problems which had arisen with certain partners associated with D&P and their work in the Developing World. The problems centered on conflicts with the Church's moral teachings on the part of some of these partners. Recognizing that development projects among the poor can only be carried out through a close collaboration between D&P and local development partners, the CCCB has noted that such local development partners must be in good moral standing with the Church. As a result, the Canadian Bishops have pointed out to Development and Peace that where there are problems of this kind with local partners, a reform of the process of how partners are chosen would need to be undertaken.

At the fall Plenary for the CCCB, the question of reforming the process of choosing partners was discussed at length. The results of these discussions indicate that a hopeful road towards reform has now been embarked upon. Although I could not attend the Plenary this fall, I am satisfied that a positive direction is now being developed by D&P in collaboration with the CCCB and I have decided to release the funds to Development and Peace that were temporarily withheld. In my letter to Mr. Serge Langlois, Executive Director for Development and Peace, I stressed that these funds are to be used only for those partners who have not been implicated in being in contradiction to the Church's moral teachings.

It must be said that there still remains much to do in establishing good policies for Development and Peace that are transparent and effective relative to this question. I am confident that this will take place. I can say with certainty that the bishops of Canada remain supportive of the work that Development and Peace has been doing for many years among the poor and needy around the world. I would encourage you to continue your support for Development and Peace and to proceed with the Fall Campaign this year. I wish also to thank the many parishioners who have supported the work of Development and Peace in the past and continue to do so today.


