

November 21/22, 2015: Solemnity of Christ the King

Christ the King: Daniel 7:13-14; Psalm 93; Revelation 1:5-8; John 18:33-37

John's Gospel portrays Pontius Pilate as a helpless figure caught between his conscience and the demands of his office. His encounter with Jesus deeply disturbed him, especially when he learns that Jesus claimed to be the Son of God. Pilate struggled to have Jesus released, but he also felt pressure of an increasingly belligerent crowd. Unfortunately, this nuanced portrait of Pilate comes at the expense of the Jewish people, who wind up playing the villain in John's Gospel. It's unlikely that the Jewish people were angry with Jesus because, "Everyone who claims to be a king sets himself against the emperor." If the people were concerned about offending the Roman emperor, it was likely because they feared the kind of violent military reprisal the historical Pontius Pilate was actually known for. It's important to point out the disparity between the historical record and the Gospels because John's Gospel has been used to justify anti-Semitic beliefs and practices in the Church, such as charging Jewish people with Jesus' murder. Having a sympathetic Pilate made the gospels more appealing to gentiles, who might have related more to Roman characters than to Jewish ones. Whatever the reasons, we get this dialogue between Jesus and the Roman prefect in John's gospel—it's a scene where the Kingdom of God comes face-to-face with the powers that be. The supposedly formidable Pilate leaves the encounter shaken to his core.

For a high-achiever like Pilate, perhaps the meeting gave him a case of imposter syndrome—a sense that one's achievements are the result of dumb luck rather than one's abilities; a feeling that, any day now, everyone else will realize it too. His failure to intimidate or convince Jesus must have been disconcerting. Perhaps he really wasn't as effective a prefect as he imagined; was it only a matter of time before others saw through his façade? If he couldn't shake down this simple prisoner, how could he be expected to keep an entire country in order? The soldiers would no longer respect him or follow his orders. The countryside would fall into revolt, and he would be recalled to Rome to answer for his incompetence. By refusing to embrace power, Jesus strips Pilate of his.

It's understandable, I think, to share something of Pilate's anxiety. After all, church has a high standard of achievement—sainthood, personal holiness—measures of goodness and piety that few of us attain with any degree of certainty. Jesus tells us to listen to him so we will belong to the truth, but, like Pilate, we can't help but ask, "What is truth?" On this feast of Christ the King, we once again ponder the great mystery God continues to speak truth to us, so we can listen and belong to Christ, even when we feel like we're faking it.
